JohnathanC: They must also select a tribute or dedication song to be played in class during the presentation

JohnathanC: Should we look at pictures of finished projects?

LindseySt: Yes please

BJB2: do you find that your students have a wide range of experience with music?

JoseMH: Yes

JohnathanC: You will need to scroll down to 2007 Memorials and please note (pun intended) the musical selection...

JohnathanC: Click on the name of each memorial to see the photos

JohnathanC: Each student must introduce the tribute song and explain how/why it "connects" to their person or event.

BJB2: how do the students find the songs?

JohnathanC: If they can't on their own, we brainstorm in class

BJB2 nods

LindseySt: Are there guidelines in regards to what is considered "acceptable" music selections for the project?

JohnathanC: students bring me the songs in advance

JohnathanC: no gratuitous profanity but one or two words if they serve a purpose are allowed

JoseMH: What made you use music?

JohnathanC: Forces students to identify a central theme or belief of the person being memorialized

JohnathanC: So how does John Mayer's song connect to Oskar Schindler (according to my student)

JoseMH: Yes, music stirs the emotions

JohnathanC: Most people familiar with the song?

JoseMH: I am not

LindseySt: I am not familiar with the song

HeatherAB: nor am I

DavidWe knows some of John Mayer's songs

BJB2 is sure that Johnathan will enlighten us

JohnathanC: One suggested that Schindler did not wait for the world to change he took action

LindseySt: I like that analogy the students made

JoseMH: You're right, we can't wait, we must be proactive

JohnathanC: Then we discussed the intent of John Mayer...is he really waiting or is he saying what are you waiting for?

HeatherAB: what did your kids come up with?

BJB2: sounds like you're treating the lyrics as poetry which you're analyzing. Very cool.

JohnathanC: They thought he was being slightly sarcastic and was saying take action though he does seem resigned in the lyrics

HeatherAB: hmm

HeatherAB: they're middle school?

JohnathanC: yes, I suggested we write one more stanza that clearly says don't wait

JoseMH: Good idea for critical thinking

HeatherAB: do you have that stanza to share?

JohnathanC: We will work on it after presentations end

JohnathanC: for next time

HeatherAB smiles and nods

JohnathanC: How about the Harriet Tubman song selection, that was a result of brainstorming

HeatherAB feels her age is showing...who's Kelly Clarkson?
