BjB : scroll down the menu on the left of the page

BjB : and take a quick look at art the 4th R

BjB: good tie-in with your interest in multimedia

RosieU: absolutely

RosieU: I will sign the petition!

CarmenAr: Hello everyone! I'm new! This is a great resource

RosieU smiles

RosieU: hi Carmen

BjB: another important page to read is the DAOW of Literacy

BjB . o O (listed on the menu of the homepage)

CarmenAr: As of now yes.

RosieU: hs...it's an apple program

RosieU: I wish we had iMovie and Garage Band

CarmenAr: I think there's CakeWalk or something like that for PC's

RosieU: and iPhoto and iWeb

BjB: Jason even has handouts on the page. http://www.jasonohler.com/resources/handouts.cfm

JulieML: Great...

BjB: I recommend that you join this group and check out the resources in this room

RosieU: thanks

CarmenAr: I love those programs. They are very user friendly and help in the storytelling process if used effectively

RosieU agrees

JosephA: I'm reading his quotations, they're pretty interesting.

RosieU: brilliant

BjB: SuTuan, we're looking at http://www.jasonohler.com/

JulieML: He is giving us his keynote! I love it!

JenniferH5: The future is a very individual thing, lasting only as long as you do. is my fav. quote

RosieU: Before you suspect conspiracy, don't rule out incompetence... how true!

RosieU laughs

BjB grins...good one in our paranoid society

MarianitaL: I checked the Jazz music he has....nice

JosephA: When surrounded by jerks I just remind myself that it could be worse -- I could be one of them. I like this quote.

JenniferH5: The future is a very individual thing, lasting only as long as you do. I totally agree with this one

RosieU: funny

JenniferH5: and Joseph's choice

JulieML: Ck/out: The science of teaching...

RosieU: I like that he offers presentations and hand-outs

JosephA: Rosie, I also like that.

RosieU smiles

JulieML: The science of teaching is knowing a number of different methodologies. The art is knowing when to use which. NICE ...

RosieU: I concur

MarianitaL: How true

CarmenAr: That is great

JulieML: The resources are just amazing!

RosieU: teaching is an art, a science, and a blessing

CarmenAr: I really like that the Getty education resources

RosieU: Bj, thanks for sharing this site!!!

JosephA: This quote is pretty true. Everything created by us contains our bias.

JulieML: We are compelled to use technology because without us it seems useless--no sense letting all that negative entropy go to waste. But when it breaks we discover who really owns whom.

CarmenAr: I didn't realize they had so much online until looking through the resources in this group

BjB nods to Carmen

BjB : do you all know how to join this group?

CarmenAr: by requesting to join it? giving you our email?

CarmenAr: I guess my answer is no :)

BjB : easier than that, Carmen

JulieML: Show the way, BJ...

BjB: do you all see the webpage that was above this chat window before you detached?

CarmenAr: yup

JulieML: Yes

RosieU: thanks

BjB: at the top of the webpage is a welcome note

BjB . o O (welcome to the art of storytelling)

RosieU: yay storytelling

JulieML: ready...

CarmenAr: I'm with you Bj

BjB: look for the sentence This is the group room for The Art of Storytelling

CarmenAr: ok

BjB: there is a green i next to the group name

BjB: click on the green i

BjB: you should now see the group ID page

BjB : at the top of the page is Join this group

CarmenAr: see it

JulieML: y

CarmenAr: Yay, I joined!

BjB : just click on join this group

RosieU: welcome Carmen!!!

CarmenAr: thanks!

BjB: to get back to the welcome screen click on Room View at the top of the page

CarmenAr: thank you Bj

RosieU: Bj, what's your favorite software for digital story telling?

BjB : Jason's subTechst Journal is good too

BjB: I don't have a favorite, Rosie...just depends on what kind of story and the person writing the story

CarmenAr: good question Rosie

RosieU: makes sense

CarmenAr: that's true

BjB: you can tell a story using comics, using a box, making a book...lots of ways

RosieU: I judge software on capabilities and user-friendliness

SuTuanL: will I get email transcription for the chat today? I feel that I have difficult to catch up with the discussion.

CarmenAr: There are so many programs out there, especially on the apple computers

DavidWe: Yes, SuTuan. When you logout - you'll get the transcript by email

JulieML: I did one with Guernica (Picasso's) for Spanish AP class.

CarmenAr: like comic life, garage band, power point, even word

BjB: don't forget the personal aspect too...the importance of listening, the importance of speaking

CarmenAr: it just depends on how you use it and the point of the project

BjB: theater is another way of telling a story...and music, poetry

RosieU agrees

JulieML smiles

JosephA: I enjoy writing plays, I think they are one of the best ways to tell stories.

CarmenAr: yes, and you can incorporate technology into these mediums to help with the storytelling

BjB: yes, Joseph!

BjB: and yes, Carmen!

JosephA: It's especially fun when you see other people act them out.

JulieML: I could see that...

RosieU: in what ways do you incorporate technology into plays?

RosieU: (I'd like to incorporate plays into my technology courses...)

CarmenAr: Proper lighting, or sounds, microphones and speakers so people can hear in the back

RosieU: got it

CarmenAr: sometimes I record my students and have them listen to themselves or see themselves so they understand the feedback

JosephA: Carmen is right, there are several ways technology works with plays.

BjB : perhaps displaying graphics as a stage set/background

CarmenAr: I do this is pe too when trying to teach a skill

JosephA: Bj I was about to type that!

RosieU giggles

BjB sits on her hands and let's the participants lead the discussion!

RosieU laughs

BjB . o O (you're doing great!)

CarmenAr: I'm sure there are a lot more

RosieU: We write screen plays and shoot films

JulieML: BJ is facilitating...

JosephA: Rosie, that's very cool.

RosieU: thanks. I work with an English teacher

CarmenAr nods in agreement with Joseph

RosieU: students write plays, shoot movies, and edit their work

JosephA: How long does it take them?

RosieU: we present in the auditorium (I bring pop corn)

RosieU: depends on the movie

CarmenAr: That's a great idea!

JosephA: That is a very good idea, I agree.

RosieU: we've done 4 day minis and 1 month epics

RosieU: we did a rendition of The Kite Runner

RosieU: after students read it in the English Class

JosephA: Cool, Rosie does each student choose what they want to do or are parts in the project assigned?

BjB: that must have been fantastic, Rosie

CarmenAr: that was my question too Joseph

RosieU: we allow them to choose teams... within a team, they decide on directors, editors, writers, etc

RosieU: everyone must contribute... there's a personal and a group grade given

JosephA: That seems like a lot of fun!

JulieML: Cooperative learning, very nice...

RosieU: The quality has exceeded my expectations

CarmenAr: do you have any of the mini's posted on the web anywhere?

CarmenAr: Like teachertube?

RosieU: not yet... we will be posting some on uTube soon

JosephA: Students can come up with a lot of interesting things. It's fun to see how creative some people can be.

JulieML: That usually happens (higher than expected quality) when we allow the students to take responsibility for their own learning

RosieU: (it's up to the students, since many of them are also actors)

SuTuanL: have to go now. Nice to meet you and thanks for the sharing.

CarmenAr: There's teacher tube too you know.

RosieU: bye

CarmenAr: <u>www.teachertube.com</u>

JenniferH5: now that is interesting as well

RosieU: thanks. I'll check it out... same idea?

JosephA: That is very interesting Carmen.

BjB nods...but just for teachers

CarmenAr: same idea as you tube, yes

RosieU: cool

RosieU: is it filtered?

JulieML. o O (looks at the clock...)

BjB: something else to check out...not exactly the same, but might be useful, is Next Vista <u>www.nextvista.org</u>

BjB smiles...well done, Julie

JulieML smiles

CarmenAr: I'm not sure, it looks like it is

CarmenAr: you can also report inappropriate videos and the webmasters will take a look at them and delete them if necessary

RosieU: cool

RosieU: I appreciate that it's free

JosephA: These websites are really cool. Teacher tube and next vista, I think I'll be up most of the night looking through them!

BjB: Joseph, Next Vista leads discussions in Tapped In once a month

BjB: their next discussion will be during the Tapped In festival on July 25

BjB: everyone know about the festival?

RosieU: if we give students creative control with language, is that automatically inappropriate (in an FCC sort of way)?

JosephA: I will have to check that out. Thanks.

CarmenAr: great to know Bj

CarmenAr: what do you mean by creative control?

JulieML: I saw it posted

MarianitaL: I have to go. Bye

BjB waves bye to Marianita

CarmenAr knows about the festival now thanks to Bj :)

RosieU: if they eloquently create characters who use poor language

MarianitaL: Julie, I will speak with you later.

RosieU: Bye

JulieML: Yes..
