EricaS: For those of you that don't know about ALTEC. ALTEC, Advanced Learning Technologies in Education Consortia, is housed in the School of Education at the University of Kansas in Lawrence, KS. We create resources, support collaboration and resource sharing, and foster alliances that help educators use the possibilities of the Internet for their students, or themselves. To pursue this goal we respond to federal and state initiated requests for proposals that support educational technology integration.

EricaS: Included in Kids' Vid are the following tools and resources:

EricaS: You have to have an external software to edit your actual footage. Kids' Vid gives tips on how to do this.

EricaS: 4Teachers.org is your solution for finding online resources that offer ready-to-use Web lessons and online assessment tools. Discover valuable professional development resources addressing issues such as equity, ELL, technology planning, and at-risk or special-needs students

EricaS: Some of the most popular tools at 4Teachers are:

EricaS: RubiStar which creates rubrics for you by offering rubric templates in English or Spanish that can be customized to fit your specific needs.

EricaS: QuizStar allows you to create a custom quiz that your students can take online. Questions can be true or false, multiple choice, and short answer. You can also upload audio, images, and movies to your quiz.

EricaS: TrackStar allows teachers to create interactive lessons online. Simply collect Web sites, enter them into TrackStar, add annotations for the students, and you have an interactive, online lesson called a Track.

EricaS: NoteStar assists students with taking notes from online sources. This tool allows them to organize their notes, and even assists them in making an MLA or APA bibliography page.

EricaS: Have any of you used these tools or other tools at 4teachers?

This multifaceted site has also appeared in hardcopy form in newspapers around the world since 1996. There is also a kid safe search engine called Cool Spots.
