A good place to start is a webquest I found on the topic -- it's a very specific endeavor. Ready to see the site? AndrewGst11: sure **BJ:** I'm a member of the Art of Storytelling...a digital storytelling group in TI that the NGA has started **UverC** joined the room. UverC: Hi everyone **BJ:** to help participants prepare for the NGA Digital Storytelling Institute this summer LeslevF: it's http://faculty.salisbury.edu/~jrbing/Telling a Digital Story/Telling a Digital Story/ LesleyF: Just click on the URL -- I'll give you about 7 minutes to explore. I'll be waiting, OK?

AndrewGst11: argh, I keep getting a not found message

UverC: Seem to having an access problem

BJ . o O ( not found on Netscape )

**LesleyF**: Hi, UverC. We're just starting to talk about digital storytelling. I shared a URL WebQuest on the topic. Let me check the spelling first, though.

AndrewGst11: gotta love technology

GinaSo joined the room.

LesleyF: got it:

**LesleyF**: Actually, when you finish looking at the Salisbury site, go to BJ's site -- storycenter.

AndrewGst11: Hmm, looks like artists are involved

UverC: Fantastic!

LesleyF: Yes, it does seem to link artie and techie types.

**LesleyF**: You had mentioned about teaching teachers so I'd like to share another URL which is a how-to. Ready for that?

AndrewGst11: I have found with the advent of the web that my art background is invaluable, and appreciated more

**UverC**: Do you think it works for students with very little computer skills? I mean, would it be a good start to get them involved or would it be too much at first?

**LesleyF**: let's look at this web site, and then I'll show you what a 6 year old can do and what MSers can do. OK?

LesleyF: Just click on the URL...

AndrewGst11: oh I wish I had a high speed connection about now....

LesleyF: connectivity can be a real bottleneck, particularly with digital images...

AndrewGst11: At first glance there seems to be ton there I want to explore

**LesleyF**: That's why it's so nice to have a copy of the transcript so you can play later. I'll be sharing about 4-5 more sites.

AndrewGst11: I'm bookmarking as we go

**LesleyF**: Let me show you what kids can do and then I'll show you some resources that are pretty low end.

LesleyF: http://www.megahedz.com/videos/copper.html

AndrewGst11: ok, give it another try

AndrewGst11: not found

LesleyF: argh --another

AndrewGst11: darn fingers

LesleyF: http://thirteen.lorg/edonline/studentstake/digitalstory

LesleyF: sorry http://www.thirteen.org/edonline/studentstake/digitalstory/

UverC: nope AndrewGst11: Yay LesleyF: These are MSers and up. UverC: Pardon me ... What is Msers? AndrewGst11: Middle Schoolers LesleyF: thanks for the translation... **LesleyF**: I also have the right URL for the 6 year old's work: http://www.megahedz.com/videos/copper.htm AndrewGst11: Hmm, I may not get to watch their videos tonight. 6.5 MB download on a dialup will take awhile **BJ**: another advantage of getting a transcript, Andrew LesleyF: www.megahedz.com has a summer camp, and their AVID products that kids did is a good sample too. LesleyF: So it "looks" like we'll look at more URLs, collecting like trophies, and then folks can look at their leisure from hefty machines. OK? AndrewGst11: are you on commission BJ? LesleyF: bet she wishes... BJ: btw, Andrew, if you click on the Actions menu in the top right of the chat window and highlight DETACH your chat window will be larger and easier to read AndrewGst11: now how did you know that I was squinting at the bottom of my screen? **BJ** chuckles...nah. I just know how useful transcripts can be...and membership is free LeslevF: So here we are with resources. The following URL is a bit less powerful so might be feasible at your school. Ready to give it a try? AndrewGst11: go for it UverC: shoot LesleyF: being paranoid at this point, I'm pretesting it this moment. **BJ** nods solemnly AndrewGst11: burn me once.... AndrewGst11: can I ask a techie question? LesleyF: www.techteachers.com/digitalstorytelling.htm LeslevF: ask away **UverC**: what basic tools should we start with? AndrewGst11: these samples, what equipment was used to produce them? LeslevF: The tech teachers site should have some resources and I'll show you another nifty little site where folks can post things. AndrewGst11: And, I'm sorry to say, the link is timing out for me LeslevF: oh glum...  $\mathbf{BJ}$ . o O ( me too! ) AndrewGst11: woe is you AndrewGst11: I can see how to do it with a Mac, but most of our schools are going PC **BJ:** are you here to participate in the digital storytelling discussion, LMC? LesleyF: http://www.storycenter.org has a section called storytelling Bee which has a spot for work. AndrewGst11: Hey, first try LesleyF: you never know

**LesleyF**: Apple has a learning exchange that shows lessons -- and of course they promote imovie, which is pretty easy to use. I'll show you that URL

AndrewGst11: I've got iMovie.

AndrewGst11: and I've been to Apple's site quite often

AndrewGst11: I was wondering what all my PC-based schools/teachers would use LesleyF: I think you're ready for the mother of all digital storytelling sites, which lists MANY different expects, including resources for both platforms. Beadw?

MANY different aspects, including resources for both platforms. Ready?

AndrewGst11: sounds good

UverC: Got to leave now. Thanks for all the tips. See you around.

LesleyF: So do you have some ideas on how you want to proceed with your faculty? AndrewGst11: Not quite yet. This will take some time to process

AndrewGst11: But I can see developing a good series of workshops, PD for them AndrewGst11: could be a heck of a lot of fun

**LesleyF**: It's usually a good idea to show them what kids can do. I also have a site that links to standards..

AndrewGst11: Sound advice

AndrewGst11: which standards?

**LesleyF**: content standards, such as what students should know in science for six grade, etc.

**LesleyF**: the more that you can get teachers to brainstorm how digital storytelling fits into their existing curriculum, the more open they'll be to learn.

AndrewGst11: I suppose each state has similar content standards.

**LesleyF**: At some sites, having the teacher team with a student for an in-service is another interesting way to approach teaching/learning these skills.

AndrewGst11: I bet the kids are often far beyond the teachers in using the tech LesleyF: but the teachers know the curriculum...

AndrewGst11: I wouldn't have thought to team the student with the teacher, though LesleyF: nice interdependence

AndrewGst11: Blogging has been generating some buzz here lately. Any experience with that and images?

**LesleyF**: The team approach works if there's a school culture that says it's oK -- some teachers don't want kids to know that they don't know, if you know what I mean... **LesleyF**: Yes, blogging is getting big too.

AndrewGst11: Yes, I've seen that. And the really neat teachers I've observed are the ones having the kids teach them

AndrewGst11: I

**LesleyF**: Just to backtrack for a second, the following URL (you saw the umbrella one) has suggestions for curricular uses for digital storytelling. http://www.techteachers.com/digstory/ideas.htm

**LesleyF**: Tell you what, since I have to see a couple of my students get scholarships in a half hour, I'm going to end THIS session early but will schedule that topic of blogging

LesleyF: The archived list of URLs should take you through all the summer re-runs

AndrewGst11: Looks good. thanks

AndrewGst11: no kidding

BJ: Julie Springer is one of the leaders of the Art of Storytelling Group

LesleyF: try to snag a kid, though, while you're exploring and see what he/she does...

**LesleyF**: little reality check -- and motivator

AndrewGst11: I'll have to use my 10 yr old niece

LesleyF: perfect

AndrewGst11: she's become quite the reader

LesleyF: all the better

AndrewGst11: and we toyed with the idea of creating our own cartoon (ala Scooby Doo)

LesleyF: digital storytelling is a good venue, then...

AndrewGst11: seems to fit very well

AndrewGst11: plus, she's a scrapbooker

**LesleyF**: better than going to their movie sequel

LesleyF: the scrapbook technique works with this too...

AndrewGst11: now the ideas are starting to churn

LesleyF: so enjoy -- glad we could have such an exclusive session!

AndrewGst11: thanks so much

LesleyF: hope to chat with you next month, same time and station.

**BJ:** Thanks, Lesley!

AndrewGst11: And I'll be signing up for an account, BJ :-0

LesleyF: adieu --

BJ smiles. Thanks, Andrew!

AndrewGst11: bye

AndrewGst11: you get your cut

LesleyF: I think we're all paid the same -- in smiles
