SusanR: Welcome Shirley. What is the typical day of a Reading Specialist? **ShirleyHe**: This week it has been to help the counselor. We get out next week.

ShirleyHe: But normally I work with 4-5 students

which is a

SusanR: variation of Bingo.

SusanR: I give students a vocabulary list of 24 words.

ShirleyHe: I have used the hinks pinks with some of my students also

JeffC joined the room.

SusanR: I give students a vocabulary list of 24 words.

SusanR: It is called "Wordo", Jeff

SusanR: They put the words in random order on the Wordo sheet with a free space.

JeffC: cool

UverC joined the room.

ShirleyHe: Do they put all 24 words on the sheet?

SusanR: I read the definition and anyone in the class can say the word.

SusanR: The first person to get Wordo reads the words to me and wins a treat--candy

bar, gum, etc.

SusanR: his is very popular with the students and is

SusanR: a fast, fun way to learn vocabulary.

ShirleyHe: It looks like the students or teacher type the words in on this site.

ShirleyHe: Is that right?

SusanR: Yes..let students create their own card and exchange them...

SusanR: I would highly recommend that you join a wonderful email discussion group

SusanR: called Mosaic of Thought.

ShirleyHe: how do I do that?

SusanR: Go to http://u46teachers.org/mosaic/ to sign up

SusanR: ...an amazing group of teachers who love to teach reading and whose

philosophy is based on the book Mosaic of Thought.

SusanR: You don't have to read the book before joining, but you might want to lurk for

SusanR: awhile and just read what everyone is talking about.

ShirleyHe: That sounds like a good idea. I have not read this book yet, but heard a lot

about it.

SusanR: Most of the group have done extensive reading about how to teach reading and they often post book titles worth purchasing.

SusanR: These sites are useful for EFL/ESL students
