MarianneH: Why not go to http://www.learningelectric.com and try some of the pieces. They have many applications and you can look at parts that interest you. How about 5

minutes and then come back and chat about it? OK?

SusanR: ok

MarianneH: Try any of the applications on the left.

MarianneH: If you don't know Inspiration you might want to look at it.

SusanR: Wow! On first reaction

SusanR: wish I had this when I was a tech integrator

LindaU: cool.. free for districts... what about teacher training programs? **LindaU**: I'll definitely get this sit out to my teachers... They'll love it..

MarianneH: There are unlimited possibilities. Now this is a free resource and has some good things in it. there is one more to look at that has even more!!

LindaU: okay.

MarianneH: Atomic Learning costs but is reasonable and is really for educators so they work with you on costs. When we go to this next one please notice the following differences.

SusanR: I will also send this site our to our Educational Technology Integrators

MarianneH: there are three columns at the top. You can look for mac applications; pc applications and also there is a curriculum are. there are free ones you can look at.

SusanR: I wonder if they will include Photoshop Elements at some time **MarianneH**: So that we can compare the differences why don't you go to

MarianneH: You might want to sign up for the free trial account. You can see more that way.

LindaU: Oh yes, I'm familiar with atomic learning. Thank you.

SusanR: Thanks Marianne

MarianneH: Linda, does your school use it? We have it at National for the whole college of ed... faculty and students.

MarianneH: Susan, Atomic Learning does have Photoshop Elements.

LindaU: Several of our instructors use it. It is one of the sites we take our teachers to...

Our Center teaches teachers to use technology in their classrooms.

SusanR: Our district is heavily into Photoshop Elements and digital media.

MarianneH: They have a far greater selection but you are paying for it. Illinois computing educators has made a great arrangement with them....

SusanR: Our district is in the midst of setting up media carts and distributing them to each school

MarianneH: All members of ICE have Atomic learning as a part of their membership.

SusanR: ICE??

MarianneH: Linda, you center might also be interested in this site -- unless you already have an assessment process of your own.

MarianneH: Yes, like CUE but CUE was the first..... ICE wasn't!!

MarianneH: look at the assessment page. You might even want to download the pdf file

SusanR: impressive

MarianneH thinks that it is nice not to have to reinvent the world for assessment of competencies.

LindaU: Thank you.. I'll take a look at it.. we've been using the CTAP2 assessment: http://ctap2.w5.iassessment.org/ia/render.userLayoutRootNode.uP

SusanR: where is the assessment again, Marianne

MarianneH: Can we all use CTAP or do you have to be in a California school?

MarianneH: Susan, Can you scroll back up and see the link?

MarianneH: Else I will enter again.. BJ, is there a way to copy a line that I don't know how to do??

LindaU: Good question... I know that all CA schools can find out how their teachers scored so they can plan their staff development in technology.. but I'm not sure if others outside the state can use it... It might be worth trying to set up an account to find out.. I can check with my CTAP friends and ask that question.

BJ: Marianne, where is the line?

LindaU: try the paste board under actions.

MarianneH: I would love to know. that is the good thing about the mass one.

MarianneH: BJ it is right where we were talking about ICE and CUE.

BJ: then Linda is pointing you in the right direction

MarianneH: looks like the mass one lets you in -- there is an invitation -- but I haven't tried yet.

SusanR joined the room.

BJ: click on the actions menu and click on SEND TO PASTEBOARD

SusanR: Sorry, Safari quit on me

BJ: you can copy text from the pasteboard

BJ: wb, Sue

MarianneH: Can't highlight it so how do I send it?

LindaU: Marianne.. my email is <u>ullahlinda@foothill.edu</u> Drop me an email reminder and I'll try to get the information to you.

MarianneH: ahhhhhh

BJ: you are trying to highlight from the pasteboard?

MarianneH: Here it is Susan http://www.doe.mass.edu/edtech/standards/sa tool.html

MarianneH: Nice trick, BJ, thanks. that is new to me!!

SusanR: Thanks, Marianne

SusanR: very handy trick, Marianne

BJ agrees.

MarianneH: I think there is a nice link for teachers -- for at least one area of the competencies -- if they can take the assessment and then go to a site where they can see how the applications work.

MarianneH: Do you all use Inspiration with teachers and students?

LindaU: I remember the old days when we had to do paper surveys, then hand tally them...

MarianneH: UGH

LindaU: Inspiration is a great program... We teach it here.... Also Kidspiration for younger kids... I love my Palm version.

SusanR: Used it myself..not with students yet

MarianneH: There is a very nice trick between Inspiration and PowerPoint that I like because you have to do all the content planning first. Are you familiar with that ability?

SusanR: We are using Smart Ideas.. Inspiration type software..also used with the Smartboard

LindaU: It's great for students.. helps them organize thought... especially for writing... I love that they can brainstorm then create an outline... then open the outline in Word, PPT, etc... great for MM projects.

LindaU: We've trained our EETT Grant teachers to use the PPT feature with Middle School Lang. Arts students.. great tool..

MarianneH: Haven't seen that -- will have to look in to it. that is what we do with Inspiration. Learned this from Marco Torres in the LA schools. Do you know him, Susan?

MarianneH: Linda?

MarianneH: You do all the planning in the brainstorming window and then....

MarianneH: you open the outline view and move the pieces around till they are in the right order.

MarianneH: When that is complete you export the file to PowerPoint... one of the menu choices. When it saves out it shows as a powerpoint icon.

LindaU: I don't know Marcos.

SusanR: That's interesting to know!

MarianneH: And the last thing is to open in PowerPoint. Each roman numeral has created its own slide AND then students can start to do the embellishments.

SusanR: don't know Marcos

LindaU: It really focuses students on learning not the glitz multimedia...

SusanR: Right

MarianneH: They can't start the decorating and glitzing till all the content is in place and organized. Love it.

MarianneH: I love what Marco calls it... It is the 4 Ps.

SusanR: Students get too involved in the glitz and neglect the content

MarianneH: Planning, Producing, Presenting and Assessing with a silent P

MarianneH: He has a great sense of humor.

LindaU: Okay.. I've heard of the 4 Ps... wonder if I've heard him at a conference...maybe the CUE conference.. who know...

MarianneH: I know him through the
