SusanR: Make-a-Flake is a Flash-based snowflake creation tool that allows you to design and cut detailed designs into a virtual paper. No mess, no melting, and lots of flakey fun!

BlairM: We are doing a Winter theme right now at our school so that is a helpful site to know

SusanR: Is there a resource or web site that you wish to share this week ...something that wowed you!!

SusanR: Have fun, Jeff

SusanR: We are in the middle of hockey season here

SusanR: we kome James. We are about to start our Great Resources session

JamesWM: Thank you I thought I would listen for a few minutes

SusanR: so the first gem I have discovered is Build your Wild Self

SusanR: I think it can be used with kinder kids and beyond.

MirukaH joined the room.

SusanR: The site, created by the New York Zoos and Aquarium, lets students create a character called their "Wild Self".

SusanR: just in time, Miruka

SusanR: Students can choose a character and then add crazy hair, arms, legs, etc. to make them wild. There are even fun sound effects for the different backgrounds they add!

SusanR: This would be a great site to use with students after reading a book like "Where the Wild Things Are"

BlairM: That sounds so cute! I bet my pre-k kids would love it!

BlairM: I could use it at their computer workstation

SusanR: Take a look and return with your comments!

SusanR: This is a great site for helping kids learn about animals and the different features (wings, fins, claws, horns) that allow them to survive in their respective habitats.

BlairM: I love how they have sound effects for the appendages

BlairM: It is very easy to maneuver

SusanR: As with any tool like this the students need a consider time to play and explore before asking them to complete an assignment

MirukaH: My kids will love this!

HannaW: This is a great resource to teach students about animals. It can also go well with the Caldecott awarded book called, What Do You Do With a Tail Like This?

BlairM: Great idea Hanna

HannaW: thanks =)

SusanR: wonderful idea

HollyMu joined the room.

SusanR: the possibilities for integration are endless

SusanR: Students could create and name a brand new creature and write up an informational guide about their new creature. This could even be turned into a class book on mutant animals or some other catchy topic.

SusanR: any comments or suggestions for integration before we move on to the next site

BlairM: Nope, so far so good

SusanR: straight forward and loads of fun

SusanR: next is a worksheet creator

SusanR: A nice worksheet creator with lots of options to tailor to a specific skill.

SusanR: kids could print their own

SusanR: Use the search feature. I just created a calendar sheet as a warmup for students in January.

SusanR: There is a handy search field

BlairM: There are so many options

SusanR: scroll up, Holly..it gives you the answers as well

HollyMu: Yes, I saw that feature. I had originally missed it LOVING that feature!

HollyMu: Trying to get to the calendar worksheet you were discussing.

BarbaraMu joined the room.

BlairM: Yeah I've been to that site before

SusanR: again I love the search feature and you can embed them on your wiki or web site

SusanR: and of course the sharing

BlairM: I like how you can see other teachers presenting their lessons

HannaW: school tube has many songs that you can teach to our students about various topics, which is great for kindergarten!

SusanR: worth exploring

SusanR: the last link is TIZMOS a visual web page ...which will include tonight's great resources ...you can use with students

SusanR: In a nutshell, Tizmos is a personalized homepage that enables you to visualize thumbnails of the sites you always visit in the same place, and dispense with visiting them out one by one to see if they have been updated.

BlairM: Now that is cool!

SusanR: Each site that you add to your homepage is entitled "Tizmo", and you can manage these easily online as Tizmos can be dropped, edited and deleted in no time at all. Moreover, you can add tags for browsing convenience. ?

SusanR: so if you were doing "weather"..it would only pull up your weather sites

HollyMu: This sounds like "speed dial"

SusanR: Hanna http://www.tizmos.com/sroseman

HannaW: my computer froze, thank you so much!

BlairM: Wow! Thanks Susan!

BlairM: I will have to take time and explore all of the sites on your tizmos

SusanR: TIZMOS can be used with Kinders as well..the thumbnails can be small medium or large

HollyMu: This is really great!

SusanR: the setup is minutes

BarbaraMu: fun site!

SusanR: don't forget to tag your sites for easy retrieval

HannaW: my school will be celebrating the 100th day of school very soon, so the 100th day project is a great resource to use!
