AGst3: I do really like science and math and teach it in my inclusive classroom

AGst3: how about you?

BJB2: I'm a retired teacher in Pennsylvania

BJB2: just go to <u>www.tappedin.org</u> and fill out a membership form, A

KimberlySL: MSP has some pubs called Explore in Depth - and that's what we do - take topics and explore them in depth

KimberlySL: first of all let's go to the science pathways page

KimberlySL: You can see there are three sections - Connecting News blog, Quick Takes (another blog), and Explore in Depth.

BJB2: looks like a lot of the topics could be done on a variety of levels

KimberlySL: on the left side under Explore in Depth - click on See More. This is a link to all of the topics we've spent some time identifying resources around

BJB2: you finding everything ok, A?

KimberlySL: Did we lose A?

BJB2 thinks A is exploring

BJB2: we also might want to show A the Beyond Penguins group at the end if this session, Kim

KimberlySL: Makes sense

AGst3 left the room (signed off).

BJB2: oops...closed the wrong window, probably

BJB2: do you know Pat Viele?

KimberlySL: We have podcasts in Beyond Penguins now - they are really good <u>http://beyondpenguins.nsdl.org/podcast/index.php</u>

KimberlySL: I don't know Pat

BJB2: she's at Cornell and mentioned an NSDL Conference

KimberlySL: A bunch of the NSDL projects are at Cornell so I'm not surprised

BJB2: she's planning on introducing TI

KimberlySL: I think a lot of people know about TI already - at least they know MSP and BPPB are using it

BJB2: the people who are comfortable with using online communities is a pretty finite group

BJB2. o O (you see the same people all the time ;-))

KimberlySL: I wish we had more people participate - which events seem to get the most people

BJB2: it's like reading entrails, Kim. I think the biggest problem is two-fold...teachers are sooo busy, they don't have time

BJB2: and there are so many other sites competing for attention that it draws from the single pool of people who would participate

KimberlySL: good point

BJB2: and, again, that pool of people is finite.

BJB2: not sure about competition from second life

BJB2: that's a different kind of community but they seem to have a growing group of educators using it

BJB2: I think I'm too old to enjoy 2nd life. I don't like the fake names

KimberlySL: that's true too - I have an avatar and spent quite a bit of time in world last year

BJB2: interacting with real people is what I love best about Tapped In

BJB2. o O (and avatars aren't my thing.)

BJB2: but that's just a personal opinion.

BJB2: something else I like about Tapped In is that you come in, have your discussion, and then leave....not a huge learning curve, no useless time-consuming chit chat or flying around

KimberlySL: all good reasons to join Tapped In

BJB2: seems like that would be more appealing to those time-strapped educators, but what do I know ;-)

BJB2: and the people who are discussion leaders are incredible...like you!

BJB2: you have such a wealth of information to share. I think there should be hundreds of people here!
