LynneW: This way, the text field will be much larger and therefore much less text

scrolling.

**LynneW**: It appears you have my undivided attention Nyly.

NylyS: cool

**LynneW**: What would you like to discuss?

NylyS: I would like my students to create their own site using open source

**NylyS**: I'm thinking about synthasite

**LynneW**: OK - high school students?

NylyS: yes

LynneW: What type and purpose do you have in mind for the actual portfolios

themselves.

**NylyS**: they are supposed to reflect about their school work

**NylyS**: show artifacts

**NylyS**: and also connect their outside life experiences

**LynneW**: What motivates you to select e-portfolios to accomplish those goals?

**NylyS**: to help them gather their work samples

**LynneW**: For graduation requirements?

**NylyS**: part of our mission statement

**NylyS**: it's not a requirement

LynneW: OK good

**LynneW**: Who will own the portfolio?

**NylyS**: students

**Lynne W**: Who will have access?

**LynneW**: Public or password protected?

**NylyS**: password protected

**NylyS**: teachers, parents

**NylyS**: students can also give it out to college admissions

**LynneW**: How long will students have access to their portfolios?

**LynneW**: Future employers?

NylyS: no

**NylyS**: maybe 2 years after they graduate

LynneW: Have you determined who will evaluate their portfolio work and what will be

evaluated?

**NylyS**: we have a life long planner

**NylyS**: he is working on the reflection part

**NylyS**: I'm more of the tech

**NylyS**: he is the portfolio and I'm the e

LynneW: What kinds of things are you still thinking about that I might be able to

discuss?

**NylyS**: I would like to have the kids to design and reflect online

**NylyS**: have u used any open source

**NylyS**: that is easy, quick

LynneW: My experience says there are some very important components for the kids to

buy in to eportfolios.

**NylyS**: if it's easy and accessible I think I can get more buy-ins

LynneW: OK - let me just get out the components and then we can survey some open

source resources.

NylyS: ok

**LynneW**: Reflection questions/prompts should be provocative and not perfunctory.

NylyS: I agree

LynneW: Appropriate kinds of reflection should be modeled and explained many times.

**NylyS**: we had them started on what did I learn?

**NylyS**: how do I know I learned it?

**DarleenR** joined the room.

**LynneW**: Perhaps you could have them address how they felt - frustrated, proud, etc.

**LynneW**: Connect personal direct experience with learning.

LynneW: Hi Darleen welcome

**LynneW**: So that they know how their body feels when learning.

**DarleenR**: Hi I'm new to this. What are we discussing

**LynneW**: Let's do some introductions.

**LynneW**: My name is Lynne Wolters and I am the facilitator for this group.

LynneW: I come to you from Vancouver, WA USA

**LynneW**: I am an ed tech teacher educator.

**DarleenR**: I am a student teacher from Medina TN

LynneW: Welcome

**LynneW**: Nyly?

**NylyS**: I'm dir of tech at independent school in CA

LynneW: Welcome

**DarleenR**: thank you

**LynneW**: Darleen is this your first time attending our group session?

DarleenR: yes

**LynneW**: Nyly and I were talking about the implementation of open source software to initiate e-portfolios in his high school

**LynneW**: What did you hope to learn from today's session?

LynneW: However, under WELCOME are links to open source resources.

NylyS: got it

**DarleenR**: I am still confused about a lot of the links.

**LynneW**: Why don't the two of you take 10 minutes to look over anything that looks interesting and then come back here to discuss.

**LynneW**: You will have to type to tell me when you are back.

LynneW: Darleen, I'll help you

NylyS: thanks

**DarleenR**: ok, thanks

**NylyS**: bye for now

**LynneW**: I had you detach the chat module from the bottom of this group room web page.

**LynneW**: If you move this a little bit aside, you will see the remainder of the group room in another window.

**LynneW**: Do you see what I mean?

DarleenR: Yes

**DarleenR**: Are you talking about the Welcome

**LynneW**: Yes there for open source resources OR

LynneW: click on LINKS

LynneW: LINKS gets you to all the posted resources

**LynneW**: Any - pick what looks interesting.

**DarleenR**: I am at mahara

**LynneW**: OK - just look around and notice what questions come up for you.

**DarleenR**: Should I register

**LynneW**: You can - it is safe.

**DarleenR**: okay

**LynneW**: Darleen, I have links to some videos

**LynneW**: Use this time to explore what is interesting to you.

**DarleenR**: Thanks be back in one minute.

**DarleenR**: I am back.

**LynneW**: I'm going to post a resource link for you here.

**DarleenR**: okay

**LynneW**: Speakaboos http://speakaboos.com/teachers

**LynneW**: Go check it out. May be a good alternative for you.

**DarleenR**: Thanks

**DarleenR** . o O ( nice site )

**LynneW**: Oh - you are here. Glad you like it.

**LynneW**: Have you got any new resources to share with me?

**LynneW**: You always find great stuff.
