**PamB**: Emily, your blog has lots of great tips and ideas.

ElizaM: I am too

**AndrewCP**: Yes, very interesting posts on your blog

EmilyW: thanks

SusanR. o O (used Emily's site to gain further insight into tagging using del.icio.us)

PamB: I plan to go back and read more. Thanks Emily

EmilyW: no problem

**AndrewCP**: I had no idea such a utility existed, referring to the tagging -- thanks for the heads up

**PamB**: Do you know who is reading your blog?

EmilyW: yes

EmilyW: some of the readers

**ElizaM**: I didn't know about the tagging either, it seems like a great way to find online resources!

**EmilyW**: (by the comments and bloglines subscriptions)

SusanR: You can use this add on <a href="http://trainque.com/code/delicious lookup.php">http://trainque.com/code/delicious lookup.php</a>

**SusanR**: allows a maximum of 7 tags to limit your search

MarianneH joined the room.

**ElizaM**: How does it work differently from a google or askjeeves search engine?

**PamB**: I'm not familiar with the tag search. Can you explain it?

SusanR hands the floor over to Emily

EmilyW: you actually don't need to go to the site for searching

**EmilyW**: there are many places for tags, but delicious seems to be the most popular site

**EmilyW**: I explained the basics in my post

**EmilyW**: if you go to <a href="http://del.icio.us/">http://del.icio.us/</a>

EmilyW: then after / put tag

**EmilyW**: if you wanted to lookup something with the blog tag

EmilyW: you would put http://del.icio.us/tag/blog

**EmilyW**: and if you wanted to find something with both blog and education

tags then you would put

EmilyW: http://del.icio.us/tag/blog+education

**EmilyW**: (you could also put education+blog)

**AndrewCP**: very cool!

**PamB**: this is very cool!

**PamB**: Do you have any other tips to locate educational blogs?

**EmilyW**: have you been to weblogged?

AndrewCP: no

**PamB**: yes, it's a great site

EmilyW: there are links to educational blogs from there

**BridgetM** joined the room.

**PamB**: let's take a look...for those who haven't seen it.

**PamB**: wait a minute and I'll get the url

EmilyW: <a href="http://www.weblogg-ed.com/">http://www.weblogg-ed.com/</a>

PamB: thanks

**PamB**: let's come back in 5 minutes

AndrewCP: ok

**BridgetM**: explore weblogged-ed?

EmilyW: yes

**MarianneH**: I clicked on bloglines.. How did that list get developed? Are there only individual educator webblogs there?

**EmilyW**: do you know what bloglines is?

MarianneH: NO, hadn't seen it before. Is it a regular portal for blogs?

**EmilyW**: it's a site where you subscribe to blogs

EmilyW: (or anything with rss feed)

**MarianneH**: So this is the subscription list of the owner of the blog we are on?

EmilyW: right

MarianneH: s/he seems to look for individuals. Is that how most ed blogs are listed. Some of the names are very familiar.

EmilyW: it depends

**MarianneH**: Do the icons tell you where the blogs are located?

**PamB**: Am I correct that classroom and school library blogs are not listed?

**EmilyW**: I do not see any

**PamB**: but perhaps the personal blogs of various educators?

EmilyW: that is what it looks like

**EmilyW** forgot what links were there

MarianneH: there is hypergene media blog but others are folks

**ElizaM**: What is a hypergene media blog?

**SusanR**: I have as one of my feeds Weblogg-ed News, Pamela

**AndrewCP**: if you go under the practices tab in the weblogged website there is a list of different read/write links that seem to be linked to the classroom

EmilyW: I've started searching for educational blogs

ElizaM: Thanks!

**PamB**: good, I'm so glad they are still there. It's such a great list.

**AndrewCP**: I know, there seems to be a blog on pretty much any topic or classroom setting you could think of

**EmilyW**: I found a great blog about math education and technology

**AndrewCP**: at least you could use these as examples to build blogs into your own classroom

**EmilyW**: the blogs I look at are more about educational topics

**PamB**: Emily, do you remember a posting on this site listing a very long bibliography of articles on blogging in education? Probably about a month ago?

EmilyW: I don't remember

**PamB**: I thought I saved it but I can't find it.

**MarianneH**: Would it be in an archive?

**PamB**: OK I'm sure I'll find it...and then I'll post it in the WebTools room feature sites

**EmilyW**: The person who wrote the math blog is very into blogs

**PamB**: yes, I have to go search. I just looked for it before the session started

**SusanR**: This was done as a part of a workshop presentation, Emily and Pam...using weblogs in education

**MarianneH**: Is that a web page or a blog.

**EmilyW**: Andrew, where is the blog link on that site?

**SusanR** . o O ( it's being used for class/school communication )

EmilyW: never mind, I found it

**AndrewCP**: it appears that way

**MarianneH**: Lower right shows recent posts but it is very selective not like most blogs.

EmilyW heads out

EmilyW waves bye

**ElizaM**: Thanks for the tagging tips.

**AndrewCP** says bye to Emily, and thanks her for her tips

**PamB**: It's almost time to end. Thanks Emily

**PamB**: Are there any questions?
