JeffC: I haven't had kids to use these sites with in a while... except for my daughter's class.

YassineS: English is Language number 3 here in Morocco

PamB: what is # 1 and #2?

YassineS: I can't get in the site

YassineS: Arabic then French (some kids learn Spanish as well)

PamB: Yassine, you need to look at the Children's International Digital Library at http://www.icdlbooks.org

YassineS: Ok, I check it...

PamB: I think it has children's books in Arabic and French

PamB: Yup, 32 in Arabic and 16 in French

YassineS: People don't read a lot here!

PamB: Why is that?

ElizabetB2: overall, or just not in English?

YassineS: I don't know. Some say that they don't have time. But it's mainly because Reading and Writing are part of education in its broad sense that starts from home...

PamB: Maybe some of these sites would be good motivators...

PamB: I have a friend who is having her students review the books in ICDL and write about them on a blog she set up.

PamB: I think the blog is the strong motivator!

YassineS: In English?

YassineS: Yes, it is. Students here blog and MSN more than anything else!

YassineS: I like the ICDL site, I'll tell my little brother (9à. He adores reading and has started writing some mini books
