**BJ:** Julie, can you please introduce yourself?

FranciaV: I think we all enjoy a good party, right!

**BJ:** Nathan, you are also in Texas?

**NathanR**: The story in my family is that the man sitting on the box is my great, great, grandfather. We are in the process of searching records...

NathanR: but he fought in the battle of San Jacinto and he was a doctor.

**MerileneM**: who are these people, Nathan

JulieDa: Wow

**NathanR**: This is a picture of General Santa Anna(blue jacket) and Sam Houston (sitting under the tree) right after Santa Anna was capture at the Battle of San Jacinto.

**NathanR**: The people in the background are Texans.

FranciaV: that is very cool

**BJ:** very cool that you have a personal connection to the artwork, Nathan!

**MerileneM**: what is the event, Nathan. if you have said already, I apologize for asking again

**BJ:** I think you arrived after Nathan had explained what the subject was

**NathanR**: After the Battle of San Jacinto (1836) that ended the Texas battle for independence.

JulieDa: I just save the picture on my document if you don't mind?

**MerileneM**: thanks, bj & Nathan

**BJ:** Julie, what are you planning to teach?

JulieDa: I'm thinking of teaching 3rd grade Math

**BJ:** nice, Julie. Do you have any ideas about integrating art into math?

JulieDa: Not really

**BJ:** I like the way Nathan is able to teach history through painting

**BJ:** there are a lot of ways to meet the different learning needs of your students, Julie. An effective way is by using art

**FranciaV**: Me too. Any ideas on how I can incorporate art with Spanish?

**MerileneM**: Julie, one way of incorporating art into math is by dimensions (i.e. size of picture, distance)

**BJ:** I have some examples I can share

**BJ:** I usually tell my kids that Rivera was one of the first graffiti artists

MerileneM: I am sure

FranciaV: I teach high school... not sure I mentioned that before

**FranciaV**: But, most of my students are freshman

**BJ:** and there is the movie about Freda

**MerileneM** . o O ( and it is wonderful, too )

**BJ:** movies and script writing are another way to use art

**FranciaV**: That's right, but I don't they would allow me to show it in school

**MerileneM**: why not

**FranciaV**: The rules state G rating only

MerileneM: I see, Francia

BJ: also copyright issues would be involved

**FranciaV**: I guess I can always send out permission slips requesting parental consent...

FranciaV: That's true too.

**FranciaV**: You guys are great... I really appreciate all of the ideas.

**BJ:** but, you could still write your own scripts...and use digital cameras. What about digital storytelling?

FranciaV: I am really excited about next year

**BJ** . o O ( we haven't forgotten you, Julie )

**BJ:** Julie, do you know about tessellations?

JulieDa: No, Madame

**MerileneM** is going to look at Nathan's site but really wants to hear what tessellations are

**FranciaV**: Thanks Nathan, this is a great website... I will share with my colleagues as well

**BJ:** ok...Julie's turn. give me a sec to get a url

**BJ:** we'll get to that, Merilene
