MiguelB: Do you know anything about blogs with sound?

BeeD: Hello!

**BJB2** hugs Bee.

MiguelB: Howdy Bee!

**BeeD** hugs BJ and Miguel

BJB2: No, Mike, but Bee might!

MiguelB: Bee do you know anything about blogs with sound?

**BeeD**: Blogs with sound? What exactly do you want to know?

EmilyW joined the room.

BeeD: you can insert sound to blogs

BeeD hugs Emily

BeeD: by using audioblogger

MiguelB: Is there a specific website with the whole thing is already setup?

EmilyW waves hi

MiguelB: Howdy Emily

MiguelB: where\*

**BeeD**: let me get you the address

**BeeD**: it's not a blogger with sound...but sound that can be added to your blog by phoning in

MiguelB: Kewl

BeeD: http://www.audioblogger.com

BeeD: can you open it? I cannot from here

MiguelB: Nope...but I will find it...

**EmilyW**: I can't either

MiguelB: Maybe it is not open during the weekends or maybe Sunday

JeanMC joined the room.

BeeD: I opened it last week

JeanMC: Hello, Hola, salut

BeeD: Bonjour JM

BeeD: There is also http://www.audioblog.com/

**BeeD**: but this one is a paid service

**BeeD**: What you can also do, if you have a server, is to record what you need on Audacity or Total Recorder and then upload the file to the server and link to it from your blog

BeeD: So...what have you been doing lately JM? Has your course finished?

JeanMC: I have finished one and still have a large group of engineers....till dec.15th

MiguelB: brb need to close out and log in on my home computer

**BeeD**: right

MiguelB left the room (signed off).

**JeanMC**: and I will begin a 4 weeks module about TICE with teachers of spanish second language

**BeeD**: I told you this morning I have a teacher from Australia who would like to find French teachers in the Southern Hemisphere...let me find the info

MiguelB joined the room.

MiguelB: Okay made it back ...

**JeanMC**: too much work with too much people: not easy to moderate more than 65 persons

**DonnaLo** joined the room.

**BeeD**: I can imagine

MiguelB: Howdy Donna

BeeD: Welcome Donna

DonnaLo: Hello!

**JeanMC**: Bee, I have just read that: 1295 véhicules ont été incendiés et 312 personnes interpellées en France dans la nuit de samedi à dimanche

**MiguelB**: I was telling Bj about my experience this morning....laptop had a virus and had to re-install everything

BeeD: terrible what is going on in France

MiguelB: Did they have some type of a riot?

JeanMC: do not know what to think about this violence

**BeeD**: Yes...lots of riots in the periphery

BeeD: protests against unemployment, discrimination and violence

JeanMC: and now out of Paris, in other towns

MiguelB: Nothing new...we have that here in the US...but still no riots...ttg

MiguelB: We had a nice visit from the KKK this week.

BeeD: No...

GrahamS joined the room.

MiguelB: Howdy Graham

**BeeD** hugs Graham

GrahamS: Hi everyone

JeanMC: Hi Graham

GrahamS: It's been a long time

**MiguelB**: Any news on the job search Emily

GrahamS: lots of multi-tasking going on here I see

BeeD: Yes...

EmilyW: I am back

MiguelB: wb Emily

BeeD: Tell us how is your podcasting going

**BeeD**: Miguel had some questions about blogs with sounds

EmilyW: I was away from the computer (no multitasking for this time)

EmilyW: I just got back home on Tuesday from 2 weeks in DC

GrahamS: Well, I've managed to start doing some regular podcasting at last

MiguelB: How is the job search going Emily?

EmilyW: had a bunch of meetings/interviews in DC

**EmilyW**: really enjoyed the city

EmilyW: hope to move there in 2006

**GrahamS**: I've got one group of students recording reports which I started uploading today

EmilyW: (Jan/Feb)

MiguelB: Kewl...I loved DC when I visited there....didn't get to see all

GrahamS: and I'm recording another group of students

EmilyW: mainly a lot of meetings and stuff with information

**BeeD**: how do you organize it?

BeeD: around themes?

EmilyW: met 2 people I talked to on Tapped In

MiguelB: Get ready for the change....things are a lot more expensive there

BeeD: I was thinking of recording my little uns

EmilyW: right

EmilyW: that's why I can't move without finding a job first

**EmilyW**: I am making progress (slowly)

BeeD: Donna...I do not think we have met yet...where are you from?

**GrahamS**: I have one class (<u>http:themetourism.blogspot.com</u>) that are recording reports on various themes

DonnaLo: I'm from Connecticut

EmilyW: I think I contacted all the web design companies in the area

EmilyW: that interested me, now I am moving on to nonprofits/associations

BeeD: Are you teaching?

GrahamS: Bee, I've found that recording in the classroom is a lot easier

**DonnaLo**: I am an intern in a public school. I taught Pre-k for 6 years.

BeeD: How do you do it Graham...on your laptop or do you have a computer?

GrahamS: I've started recording various activities that I'm doing anyway

GrahamS: I use a portable mp3 recorder with a built-in mic

BeeD: IC

DonnaLo: Taking a ed tech class and the prof wants us to check out this site

GrahamS: I switch on the REC button, lock the controls so they can't switch it off and record

EmilyW: what is your ed tech class about?

GrahamS: then I edit the audio later

**BeeD**: Oh...right...I'm an EFL teacher from Sao Paulo, Brazil and Graham is in Barcelona, Spain...we do a lot of blogging

**BeeD**: and podcasting

**DonnaLo**: The class is about adaptive tech, assistive tech and how to use the internet in the classroom

GrahamS: Are you interested in blogging Donna?

**BeeD**: I tried to record my students' introduction in class one day...but did not know how to edit it later...so it came out as it did...it was used for a project with a school in the Netherlands

**DonnaLo**: haven't really given it much thought

**GrahamS**: I carry my mp3 recorder around with me Bee, take it to the classroom, and if a suitable opportunity comes up, it's available

**BeeD**: this is a good idea

EmilyW: what is your position at the public school?

MiguelB: How do you add it to a blog?

DonnaLo: Mostly I sub, but, whatever they need me to do I do!

**GrahamS**: I'm getting my students used to me recording them - at first they react strangely, but it's getting better

**GrahamS**: I upload the audio file to server space, Miguel, and then add a link with a 'podcast' graphic

**MiguelB**: Well we have to get permission to do anything with the kids....parental, district, and school consent...

MiguelB: Okay...

GrahamS: I asked my director about this, and it's OK so long as I'm not taking photos...

**GrahamS**: ...or selling their work

**DonnaLo**: Graham...any reaction from parents?

JeanMC: Graham. do you work with kids or adults?

**GrahamS**: My idea is to eventually get other teachers involved, to create a 'window' on what's going on in the classroom, for parents, students and teachers to see

GrahamS: I work in an academy for Young Learners, and at a university

**GrahamS**: I've just started to publicize the young learners blog, getting the students to listen to it at home (and their parents)

BeeD: are you podcasting with both groups?

**GrahamS**: Yes : the <u>http://bylpodcasts.blogspot.com/</u> site is for the YL and the other one for the tourism students

GrahamS: <u>http://themtouris,.blogspot.com</u>

GrahamS: oops <u>http://themetourism.blogspot.com</u>

BeeD: right...I opened a blog for my beginners...and recorded some poems

**BeeD**: they enjoy it

GrahamS: great

BeeD: http://6eme05.blogspot.com/

**BJB2**: Question for you all....

BeeD: how old are your young learners?

BJB2: if you could upload podcasts in Tapped In would you do it?

GrahamS: 12 Bee

GrahamS: good question BJB

BeeD: Oh...it would be great if they could correspond with ours

MiguelB: I could not listen to the podcast on the tourism site.

**BJB2** listens to responses

BeeD: Have a look at our Halloween party last week http://spintel.blogspot.com/

EmilyW: I don't do podcasts, so no

BeeD: Oh ... sorry BJ ... I was looking for the address to show Graham

**GrahamS**: One way of tying in with text chats is to record a presentation and then invite a text chat about it later

GrahamS: I'm planning on doing that at the Webheads convergence in 2 weeks

GrahamS: I want to use Tapped In for the chat

BeeD: I am not podcasting yet...just recording things I add to my blog

**BeeD**: maybe I should...

DonnaLo: Thanks for letting me sit in!

DonnaLo: Talk to you again!

**BJB2**: the reason I'm asking is that there was a recent discussion about the next phase/level of Tapped in

**GrahamS**: One of the things I like about podcasting it is I can get (hopefully) a real audience for my students

BJB2: Thanks for joining us, Donna

**DonnaLo** left the room (signed off).

GrahamS: BJ - I think webcasting would be a good way to go

**BJB2**: Some of the ASO participation has dropped drastically and we need to figure out why

GrahamS: I'm sure it's because of the voice chat rooms / VOIP webcasting

BeeD: Yes...I think there are so many places out there now

**EmilyW**: people don't have time

BeeD: and people having their own personal place to interact

**BeeD**: like blogs

BJB2 nods

BeeD: which is open and of easy access

**GrahamS**: I introduced a group of teachers to Tapped In on Friday (I was at a conference in Madrid)

**BJB2**: do you feel that Tapped In as a community of practice still has a place for teachers to collaborate?

GrahamS: And they responded very well to it

BJB2 . o O ( provides a viable opportunity for teachers )

**BJB2**: thanks, Graham

BeeD: It used to be...

JeanMC: Barbara, I have posted 3 lines in Cynthia's blog

**BeeD**: Thanks Jean Michel...she will be happy

GrahamS: I think the fact that we're here today BJ means that we do

JeanMC: in French!

BeeD: Jean Michel!!!

BJB2 nods to Graham...that's why I'm asking this group for advice

EmilyW: I think Blogstreams is still active

**EmilyW**: and comes to sessions

**EmilyW**: it seems like other sessions/groups are lacking

GrahamS: I think that there are also times when you don't want to use voice, for example

BeeD: What came out of the meeting on Monday? I am sorry I could not come

**BJB2**: I'm working on the transcript now, Bee. I'll post to the TI Needed Features group room

BeeD: ok

BeeD: I had some people having trouble accessing it because of the java

**MiguelB**: I know that a lot of the teachers in my school don't know about Tapped-In and when I tell them...they just blow me off...

**BeeD**: There was a time I was always here...but then you move into other areas and do not have as much time to attend it all

**MiguelB**: Well I spend most of my week teaching at nights...so don't have time to join in...

EmilyW: I am always here and I observe how many people log in

BJB2 understands that time is an issue...but you are always here for your session, Bee

**BJB2**: So I don't think it's unrealistic to think that people could log in once or twice a month for a discussion related to their discipline

BeeD: yes...but then it is a commitment I made

BJB2: why did you make that commitment?

EmilyW: maybe the times don't work for them

**EmilyW**: maybe they have times on other days to meet

BJB2 feels like she should be committed

**BeeD**: because I wanted to maintain contact with the people who were interested in blogging

BeeD: after the Evo session

EmilyW: BJ is committed, always at her sessions

**BeeD**: but not many people are ...apparently

GrahamS: I plan on using TI with the next EVO session (Podcasting) I do

**BeeD**: they come for a special session

BJB2 nods sadly

**MiguelB**: Well I am a newcomer and you got me interested...and still working on new blogs now.

MiguelB: Mine are in Mathematics...my major...

BeeD: well...I am happy you enjoy it Miguel

EmilyW: I agree with Bee, they come to a special session

BeeD: I do not know whether it is better to work with a pre-fixed agenda once a month...

**EmilyW**: (usually)

EmilyW: maybe the topics don't interest the members

GrahamS: More people come for special sessions

**BeeD**: because they are more focused

EmilyW: There were over 30 at the SIGTC session

**EmilyW**: which was amazing

**BeeD**: what is the sigtc session?

**BJB2**: not always, Graham. That's the problem. It's embarrassing to invite guests and then not have people participate

EmilyW: it was about blogs, vlogs, podcasts

GrahamS: I see what you mean BJ

BJB2: Special Interest Group Tech Coordinators from ISTE

EmilyW: what if there was a way to make a blog for Tapped In

GrahamS: so many acronyms, so little time... (what is ISTE?)

**EmilyW**: and include some of the session transcripts

**BeeD**: who would write in it?

BJB2: <u>www.iste.org</u>

**EmilyW**: and maybe members could share their thoughts that way

**BJB2**: if people don't have time to attend TI sessions, how are they going to have time to post to a blog?

BeeD: It would open it a bit yes...

GrahamS: I think adding a blog space to people's office might be a good idea

EmilyW: or maybe put it in a discussion

**EmilyW**: discussion could work

BeeD: it's difficult

BJB2: Graham, if your blog is on a url you can do that yourself

BJB2: just feature the url on your welcome page

**EmilyW**: For example, Bee and I, both active members of TI, could not make it to the session on Monday

**EmilyW**: If part of the transcript was posted in group like TI needed features, we could share our thoughts

EmilyW: even though we missed the session

GrahamS: yes, but I mean a space for showing posts rather than the URL

**BeeD**: the trouble is that Tappedin is locked behind a password so we have no RSS indicating there is material there

**BJB2**: then I will look forward to your posts to the discussion board in the TI Needed Features Group room, Em

BeeD: you must log in to post

**EmilyW**: This wouldn't be a blog

BJB2 nods

**EmilyW**: you would need to login to post on the discussion boards and view the messages

BeeD: and our offices are not open to the outside world either

**EmilyW**: the discussion is not used as much anyway

BeeD: you cannot link directly to them

BJB2: would you want that to be a feature, Bee?

BJB2 . o O ( I don't think it would be possible though )

BeeD: Maybe it would be easier for people to access it...I don't know

BJB2: having the community password protected is an important feature

BJB2: it used to be that guests were able to post to discussion boards...

BJB2: but we got too much junk and inappropriate stuff

**BeeD**: yes...I can imagine

EmilyW: I like having it password protected

**GrahamS**: BJ, thinking about podcasting/audio - what about if there was a feature to leave a short audio message in your office, and for visitors to respond to this by uploading their own audio too?

EmilyW: especially when students (in k-12) log on here, imagine what they could post

BJB2: that is kind of what I had in mind, Graham

GrahamS: That would be cool

EmilyW: and others who don't understand TI

BeeD: sound files are usually huge

GrahamS: It would personalize things - we would be able to hear how people sound

BeeD: if everyone posts audio...this would be very difficult

GrahamS: 1MB for 1 minute more or less (mp3)

BJB2 nods to Bee.

EmilyW: it would be hard

BJB2: but the podcast intro to an office would be cool.

**EmilyW**: what if it was only available for sessions and people who use their room for teaching

**GrahamS**: Loudblog has a feature that allows for uploading audio, and you can restrict the file size

BJB2 . o O (maybe not feasible, but we're brainstorming so anything is possible!)

**BeeD**: but then it would not be a podcast, would it? it would not be re-transmitted but only a recorded file in an office

GrahamS: not a podcast, but an audio feature in TI would be great

EmilyW: we have the limit already for the amount of space being used for files

EmilyW: it was just add additional space

**GrahamS**: for it to be a podcast, it would have to be linked to a feed and downloadable from outside of TI using a tool like iTunes or iPodder

**BJB2**: it is getting very dark out with severe storm/wind warnings. The system that created tornadoes in Illinois last night is moving through....

BeeD: yes...just like posts in blogs

BJB2: so if I leave suddenly, you'll know why

BeeD: wow

**BJB2** . o O ( I got blown away )

**BeeD**: hold tight

GrahamS: hang on there

BJB2: very weird...not a leaf is moving

BeeD: when it is silent like this it is about to come

**BeeD**: all stops still

BeeD: it's like this in the countryside as well

**BJB2**: think I'll not play with fire. Thanks a million for your input. I'll edit the script and post to the TI needed features group as well.

**BJB2**: see if we can get a dialogue going

BeeD: ok..take care

**BJB2** hugs all...take care
