KarrieF: Hi, we are here for a class in technology.

BJB2: you're in for a treat, Karrie

BJB2: Kevan has some really cool stuff to share

KevanN: yes...applied technology using the web site of the Mpls. Institute of Art and the Walker Art Center in MN

BJB2: how about if we start with introductions, please, Kevan?

KevanN: sure!

BJB2 . o O (and perhaps we'll pick up a few more participants)

KevanN: Kevan Nitzberg, ArtsConnectEd trainer and art department chair of Anoka H.S.

KevanN: How about you, Karrie?

BJB2: I'm an art teacher in Pennsylvania and a helpdesk volunteer for Tapped In

KevanN: and BJ...lol!

KarrieF: besides Karrie another participant is with her. we are in the same class. My name is Joyce

BJB2 smiles...hi, Joyce!

KevanN: welcome Joyce...names can be deceptive (grin)

KevanN: Are you familiar with the MIA or the Walker Art Center?

BJB2: where are you located, Karrie and Joyce?

KarrieF: we are not familiar with either. Karrie is a jr. high teacher and I teach 6th

grade.

KarrieF: we are from Utah, Salt Lake City.

KevanN: OK...well the MIA (Mpls. Institute of Art) and the Walker Art Center are the two major museums in Mpls. The MIA is more of a traditional museum in terms of its range of work and the Walker is devoted to strictly contemporary art.

KevanN: Welcome Jeff.

KevanN: ArtsConnectEd is their web site and allows the user to engage in a wide range of activities.

BJB2 . o O (for two people, Karrie is sure quiet!)

AsterM joined the room.

ShaunaD joined the room.

CiaranM joined the room.

BJB2: Hi, Aster and Shauna and Ciaran. Welcome!

BJB2: we've just done introductions

KevanN: Welcome Aster, Shauna and Ciaran!

CiaranM: hi

BJB2: please tell Kevan where you are located and what you teach

ShaunaD: Thank you

CiaranM: Italian in Ireland

AsterM: Hi everyone! I just came on board.

AsterM: What was the discussion?

ShaunaD: west Jordan, Utah and I teach third grad

KevanN: I was introducing ArtsConnectEd to the group.

AsterM: Miami, city of the Heat.

KevanN: Anyone else need to introduce themselves?

KevanN: OK then...

KevanN: Let's get started...

KevanN: First a brief intro as to what ArtsConnectEd is...

KevanN: This is the name of the interactive web site that is operated by the Mpls.

Institute of Art and the Walker

KevanN: Art Center...in Mpls.

AsterM: I studied in Mpls. Super people and place

KevanN: The site allows all users to participate in a variety of programs and functions

that engage the user in arts based learning

KevanN: It is a great place...and I am a NYC transplant!

KevanN: Let's go to the site and I will lead you on a tour...ok?

KarrieF: ok

AsterM: I'm ready

ShaunaD: right on

KevanN: First, everyone should detach their chat screen - do you know how to do that?

KarrieF: no

ShaunaD: no

KevanN: If not, go to the top right hand corner where it says 'Actions' and scroll down to

detach

KevanN: This will allow you easier viewing of the screen and the chat box

BJB2: Hi, Katie. Welcome

KarrieF: yes

BJB2 . o O (good job, Kevan!)

KevanN: Welcome Katie...we are just about to go on tour.

KatieSh: Thank you

KevanN: A virtual field trip as it were...lol!

BJB2: when Kevan shows you a url, if you have a pop up blocker, turn it off or hold down the ctrl key on your keyboard

AsterM: okay

KevanN: here we go then...(thanks BJ)... http://www.artsconnected.org

KevanN: Once you get to the site, come back to the chat screen

KevanN: This is ArtsConnected's main screen....

KevanN: The different icons are all hyperlinks to the various main screens. Click on the Art Gallery first.

KevanN: The format that is used splits the screen into 2 parts: the search screen on the left and the activities screen on the right.

BJB2 . o O (what you are doing is 'guided surfing' ...something you can do with your students in the K-12 Student campus)

KevanN: OK then...

KevanN: The search screen allows you a variety of search tools regarding where you might wish to look and what you are looking for. The primary sources are the 2 museums. There are also search tips posted to help you conduct more efficient searches. It is helpful to make sure that you have the 'only show art with images' checked

KevanN: OK....Let's look at the programs on the right

KevanN: First there is Topics in Focus...

KevanN: This is a link to a number of different programs that the museums have created...

KevanN: Click on Topics in Focus now

KevanN: You will see that there are a number of intriguing programs that you can go into which would literally take a lot longer than we have tonight - you can go back to them later and explore at you leisure. I would like to point out a few - starting with Artists Toolkit

KevanN: OK...Click on Artists Toolkit

KarrieF: Are there good areas in the museum for social studies, ancient cultures or geography?

KevanN: The Toolkit is comprised of a series of short animated films that the museums created to illustrate the elements of art and the principles of design. Turn on your sound to get the full effect.

KevanN: Let's first go to Explore the Toolkit and click on it

KevanN: Each of the areas that you see have different animations attachd to them. Try clicking on Space and Depth

KevanN: If you have a dial up connection (as I do), it takes a little while to load

KevanN: Be patient

KevanN: This is a great animation for a Saturday night...lol!

KevanN: Notice that the animation ends up as an actual work of art. This is the format for each of the films posted here

KevanN: Try another film once you have been through the Depth example

KevanN: Another nice feature here is that you can save specific films and keep them for showing to students by using the Create My Toolkit option

BJB2: cool, Kevan!

KevanN: Karrie / Joyce - to answer your question earlier, yes, there are great programs for social studies and ancient culture - we will explore some of those as well

KevanN: OK...let's Back out of the Toolkit and go to another program in Topics

KevanN: Let's click on the Art of Asia

KevanN: Everyone with me?

BJB2 nods

KevanN: OK!

KatieSh: Yes

KevanN: Notice that this site provides you with a number of different subtopics to explore

KevanN: All of the artwork here is at the Mpls. Institute of Art

KevanN: OK...More exploring - back to Topics again...

KevanN: Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on World Myths and Legends...

KevanN: When you arrive, click on the Compare and Contrast feature

KevanN: This program allows you to give your students an online and interactive learning experience. Select any 2 of the works pictured on the Compare and Contrast screen...

KevanN: Notice that they appear in the box to the right...

KevanN: Click on Begin Essay

KevanN: The images are shown in a larger format and a text box opens up below to allow the students to write their own comparative essay. It can be as simple as this is a image of a and an image of a, or it can become much more involved...

KarrieF: This is cool, it would be fun to have students compare and contrast works of art.

KevanN: They can also click on the More Info button as well as the Enlarge button to both get more information about the work as well as looking up close at the work

KevanN: The essays are also printable, Karrie - see the bottom of the page

KevanN: OK...shall we continue on?

KarrieF: yes

KevanN: Alright...go back to the Art Gallery page that Topics was introduced to you on

KevanN: You will notice the 2 red dice displayed there

KevanN: these dice are the icon for Art Sampler which will bring up 10 random images

at a time

KevanN: Try it

KevanN: hmmm...I am getting an error message

KatieSh: Me too

KarrieF: me too

KevanN: Perhaps it is being worked on...well, no matter - let's take a look at another page -

KevanN: go to the top and click on Playground

KevanN: Playground is a series of activities for different age groups.. click on Make It

KevanN: Then click on the stamp icon for Postcards

KevanN: You can send an 'email' postcard to anyone online with a work of art on it as well as your message - and best of all, no charge for postage!

KevanN: Select a category...

KevanN: Seems like some of these categories are down at the moment as well. Foot in the Door is working, however so click on that

KevanN: well, those images also are not available at the moment... well when this DOES work, it is a great way to send art to folks anywhere and everywhere...it is also a great pr tool for communicating with parents, administrators, students, etc.

KevanN: Go back to Make It and click on the turtle

KevanN: This program creates a series of downloadable coloring pages of famous works of art that are then printable

KevanN: If you would then go back to the Playground and click on Explore It, you will find a whole other set of activities and so on...

KevanN: Check out Another Look for example...

KevanN: OK.... I want to show you one other feature in ArtsConnectEd this evening....

KevanN: If you go back to the Art Gallery, we are going to take a look at Art Collector (the box of marbles)

KevanN: Art Collector allows you to create a collection of images and text as well as hyperlinks to online sites. The Collection is also sharable as it can be published and receive its own URL.

KevanN: In my office, I have a series of files that you can look at which will further explain how this works and what some of my collections look like.

KevanN: The 4th link down provides you with directions for using this feature as it links to a collection I created for this express purpose. You will need to create a log in name and password to sign in.

KevanN: Note, there is no reminder feature so once you have done that, write the information down. Once forgotten there is no way to retrieve your work from that log in.

KevanN: I am going to have to go now, I am afraid...Our farm is on the market and I have to take advantage of the rest of today's light to mow. I hope that this proved to be helpful and interesting. I will be back again in July for another session.
