SusanR: I am a K to 8 Occasional Teacher, former Tech Integrator and dedicated grade 1/2 teacher

JeffC: I'm on Helpdesk here... Val just sent me a message that she had to leave, but I told her to stay logged in for the transcript. She teaches 4th grade.

EmilyW: I am a helpdesk volunteer

FredK: I tutor

SusanR: I guess that's it..a small intimate group

SusanR: All teachers are stretched for time, but none more so that those working with our younger students.

SusanR: I hope you will come away from this session with many ideas to help in your planning for the new school year.

SusanR: Let's explore way cool tech tools that will motivate students and save you time!

SusanR: Let's start with a search engine called Grokker

SusanR: a new kind of search engine

SusanR: packed with features

SusanR: acts as a navigational tool, to sort through deeper data that the typical search engines never touch upon.

SusanR: let's explore and play with it..and search for your areas of interest

SusanR: come back in 5 minutes and comment

SusanR: oh btw you can filter by date, category, time span, source, relevance, key word, type of document, and much more

EmilyW: link? (I know the address but it might help to include it for the transcript)

SusanR: http://www.grokker.com/

SusanR: I chose to key in ... Literacy Lesson Plans

SusanR: Notice you can post to del.icio.us if you have an account

SusanR: there is more to life than Google

EmilyW: but this searches vahoo in a different way

SusanR: searches Yahoo and Wikipedia and Amazon

SusanR: notice the outline view which is expandable

SusanR: or if you prefer a map view

SusanR: once you peruse a site and find it relevant you can add it to a working list

JeffC: reminds me a bit of kartoo... I like the fact that you can immediately add sites to delicious.

SusanR: yes, very much like Kartoo; but more efficient

SusanR: the email feature..and a further search within the outline

SusanR: by domain..by date

SusanR: The more I played with it...the more I thought I would use it along with Google

SusanR: quite full featured

FredK: I was somewhat overwhelmed by the 141 results for Literacy tutor training

FredK: I didn't try the tools yet

SusanR: zero in by using the outline format

FredK: I expanded and contracted

SusanR: 7 lessons for Tech and Literacy

SusanR: you can dump the results onto a separate website for others to view

SusanR: save the results to your desktops or send to friends

SusanR: for students ... I recommend

SusanR: OneKey - Search Engine for Students http://www.onekey.com/

SusanR: comments???

EmilyW is exploring

JeffC: not completely safe

SusanR: there is a non profit domain, Emily

SusanR: nothing is completely safe on the INTERNET, Jeff

EmilyW: it's not safe

EmilyW: where Sue?

JeffC: I don't like it when search engines say they're "kid safe"... because you can still find all kinds of nasty things by just playing around... although "porn" is filtered... "sexx"

isn't... neither is "sex"

SusanR: oh

SusanR: what grade levels do you support, Fred

FredK: "Fun Math" brought up some of my favorites

SusanR: as a Literacy Coach

FredK: We focus on adults

SusanR ok

FredK: But some of them are at the lower grade levels

SusanR: jalbum may serve as a useful tool

SusanR: may prove to be a useful tool for developing online albums of your digital images

SusanR: claims to be the easiest to use and most powerful tool in this category, and it's

free.
