**SusanR**: Give Google's new test search engine, SearchMash a try here... http://www.searchmash.com/

**SusanR**: You will notice some new features here

**KimberlyLS**: I like Ms Dewey; I've never even heard of it before; it's pretty neat

**SusanR**: which google may implement later

**JenniferPe**: I've never seen a website like this interesting

**SusanR**: Since SearchMash is in testing stage, certain features may come and go as you use it.

**HelenK**: I like the nice clean look and it gave me some great results

**KedrickN**: I like the way the web pages drop down when you choose to view more

**SusanR**: searchmash can give you some alternate results

**SusanR**: Please leave ms Dewey.com for a rainy day.

**HelenK**: don't think I would send students to ms dewey

**KedrickN**: why not Helen?

**DavidWe** . o O ( library science students? )

**HelenK**: well while I was waiting for my search results she was reading the Kuma Sutra which may not be something younger students should be directed towards

LinhN: I agree

**DavidWe** laughs

**KimberlyLS**: interesting

DavidWe: I've not seen that one...

JenniferPe: yes I agree too

**KimberlyLS**: we should hope that students are not familiar with that

SusanR: I am back again

**SusanR**: So much for new search engines

SusanR: Story Souvenirs

**SusanR**: using story bits in your program

**SusanR**: Take a look and return with your comments

SusanR: or BookPALS Storyline Online

**SusanR**: Streaming video program featuring famous people reading children's books aloud...an excellent springboard

SusanR: for younger students

**KimberlyLS**: that is an excellent idea

**LinhN**: this site is really neat

**HelenK**: I LOVE Storyline - last year they had Tom Hanks reading Polar Express - great coming into the holiday season

**SusanR**: yes, Storyline Online is a division of BookPALS (Performing Artists for Literacy in Schools)

**KeyanaJ**: wow, I forgot about that website

**SusanR**: and each story on this site features accompanying lesson plans and activity guides.

**LinhN**: yes, very interesting

LinhN: I will definitely use this site in the future, thank you for sharing

**KedrickN**: Me too Linh

**KeyanaJ**: I'm going to bookmark it
