PatriciaCh: it is a terrific program....it shows how ...what the kids learn put into reality....and there is a lot of scholarship money out there

PatriciaCh: on the high school level - there are two program VEX and FRC

PatriciaCh: VEX ...the program kicked off in the fall.....cost of the program is less than FRC....the robots are smaller in scale...

PatriciaCh: FRC cost more to run....and the robots are much bigger....

PatriciaCh: the kids love FRC...bigger is better for them

PatriciaCh: I am involved with FRC....our team # is 180....we started a VEX team this

year

JessicaMur: WOW!!! that's amazing. Our robots are tiny things that deliver valentines to the preschoolers

PatriciaCh: the robot is 130 lbs with the batter...

PatriciaCh: that is why the kids like FRC....the robots you are referring to is like the VEX bots

JessicaMur: so how can a school get involved?

PatriciaCh: this a terrific program....it can involve the smartest to the I don't care about school

PatriciaCh: you need engineers to help with the designing of the robot...

PatriciaCh: you need the support of your principal and school board

PatriciaCh: the cost is high.....there is a cost limit - for the construction of the robot....but entrance fees are high...and cost of transportation and hotels adds up as well...I think the cost is around \$40 - 50,000

JessicaMur: oooooooh

JessicaMur: wow

PatriciaCh: I believe the cost of 1 regional and Atlanta....just fees alone....is about \$15,000

JessicaMur: besides the actual competition and construction, what else does it involve?

PatriciaCh: the fees.... you get a kit...you can build a robot from the kit and be competitive

JessicaMur: and you mentioned scholarships earlier?

PatriciaCh: time is a major factor

PatriciaCh: you have 6 weeks to design and build this robot....this is a crucial week for all teams

PatriciaCh: the robot has to be shipped to a regional event - put on a Fed Ex truck - no later than 5 PM on 2-20

PatriciaCh: yes...there are lots of scholarship...some are regional type...like midwesterns only...some are school specific

JessicaMur: very involved. is this a high school level event only?

PatriciaCh: FRC and VEX is high school only...FLL and JFLL - middle and elementary schools respectively...

PatriciaCh: Olin College of Engineering is offering a \$130,000 for all students who are admitted ...they are located in Boston...they have been doing this for the last 4 years
