JenW: Math, Science, History, Technology, English

JenW: thanks Susan

JenW: I think it looks a bit more professional

JenW: and Bruce -- there are always standards posted

JenW: I was thinking of doing something with coloring of the "STUF" in the cookie

JenW: but put their review, their thoughts, their character studies

JenW: etc -- on the wiki

JenW: and if classrooms want to

BruceCF: in for 10 more. It was bath time. I assume this project brings kids together

doing the same project across the country

JenW: they can TEAM UP

JenW: YES

JenW: we collaborate all over the world with some projects

JenW: anyway -- I am excited about possibilities

JenW: this is the 50th anniversary of "THE CAT IN THE HAT"

SusanR: I like the emphasis on world collaboration

JenW: LOL-- my first goal was all 50 states

JenW: then the WORLD

JenW: and then I have ONE more project - that I am excited about too

JenW: let's see

JenW: O.R.E.O. IX

JenW: Salute to Seuss

JenW: and ----

JenW: "THE SHAPE OF THINGS" --

JenW: or it might be called "How do you SHAPEUP?"

JenW: every student --

JenW: or classroom ---

JenW: it is up to the teacher

JenW: will print out the same pieces of paper with shapes on them -- (provided by me)

JenW: the same amount of circles, triangles, squares

JenW: ovals

JenW: in a variety of sizes

CamilleL: the possibilities are endless...

JenW: yes

SusanR: I am letting my imagination go wild at the moment, Jen!

JenW: and everyone will start with the same amount of opportunity

BruceCF: just checked out the site. Cool. that sounds interesting. in the album, do the kids write about the creations, the process, or use creative writing?

JenW: Bruce--- the older kids, that would be awesome

JenW: the younger kids -- it would be up to the teacher

CamilleL: nice connection, Bruce.

JenW: I think we are going to see some REALLY CREATIVE renditions

JenW: 3D and more

BruceCF: I would like to see who (older kids) could recreate famous works of art. Image Picasso and Dali like this!

SusanR: easy to implement for younger students

JenW: Bubbleshare is NOT the only Photoshare program on the internet

SusanR . o O (a good idea to play around with bubbleshare on your own)

JenW: I just find it to be the most friendly for K6 projects

CamilleL: I'm thinking this is not only artistic, but could be therapeutic as well =).

JenW: Yes

JenW: I think -- well I hope

JenW: it is going to be AWESOMELY creative

JenW: Camille -- what grade are you ??

CamilleL: WOW! Can't wait to see it!

CamilleL: right now, I'm coaching teachers in K to 3.

JenW: Excellent
