BjB: Jade and Henrietta, are you both teachers?

JadeRHB: yes, grade 4

BjB: how long have you taught?

HenriettaF: Yes I am, I am returning to school for my Master's now.

JadeRHB: this is my 7th year

HenriettaF: I teach Kindergarten for 11 years

JadeRHB: am doing my masters through distance education

BjB nods to Jade and Henrietta...so you are both experienced!

HenriettaF: I thought about it but I'm a visual learner.

BjB: let's start the discussion and see what we can come up with...

HenriettaF: ok

JadeRHB: ok

BjB: you may want to go to the Actions menu in the top right of this chat and click on detach

BjB: that will make it easier for you to read the chat text

JadeRHB: that's better

HenriettaF: wow much better

BjB: Jade, you've been logged in before, but Henrietta is new...any advice for her?

BjB: I do find that online courses take a great amount of self discipline

JadeRHB: well, I'm still learning myself but it helps to go through the archives

HenriettaF: It does

JadeRHB: this year is especially difficult as it's very independent

BjB: good tip, Jade. Henrietta, the archives are at www.tappedin.org/transcripts

HenriettaF: thanks I appreciate it

BjB: please tell me what brings you to the Assessment discussion?

JadeRHB: if you don't mind, I'll stay for half an hour and then zip back to my show

BjB understands

HenriettaF: for me it is a requirement for my class

JadeRHB: my final practicum for my masters is based on integration,

BjB: and how does that relate to assessment, Jade?

HenriettaF: I chose this one because it looked interesting because I do teach

JadeRHB: I want to be sure that I assess well through integration

JadeRHB: e.g. the assessment touches various competencies

BjB: how will assessment be done?

BjB . o O (I'm being a little dense tonight and not sure I understand, Jade)

BjB: do you assess competencies or learning objectives?

JadeRHB: well, I haven't yet planned the practicum exactly, I expect to plan units that I can observe the students achievement in various competencies

BjB: so observation is one way to assess...any other ideas?

JadeRHB: well, in Quebec it's learning objectives that inform the competency

BjB: Henrietta, do you have any ideas?

JadeRHB: through their daily work

HenriettaF: observation is a great way to assess. In my class most of my daily assessment is through observation

JadeRHB: conferencing too

BjB: have you thought of using portfolios?

JadeRHB: we have portfolios too

BjB . o O (student led portfolio discussions are very useful)

JadeRHB: we try and have the students select work as well as the teachers

JadeRHB: rubrics, self and peer assessment

JadeRHB: especially during oral presentations

HenriettaF: I teach on the early childhood level so portfolio's would not be useful

JadeRHB: kindergarten have a portfolio at our school I'm not exactly sure how it works though

BjB: what grade, Henrietta?

HenriettaF: Kindergarten

BjB: I think that kindergarten is a good place to start learning about portfolios

HenriettaF: have any ideas?

BjB: allowing the children to make choices about what they feel are the best examples of their learning

JadeRHB: you can include specific work or use a piece where you see real improvement

BjB nods to Jade

JadeRHB: when I taught K I had them do a picture of themselves every month

HenriettaF: Wow thanks very interesting I'll give it a try and introduce it to my principal

BjB smiles. did they get taller?

JadeRHB: what I find difficult is the students always choose the work they got right

BjB: wouldn't you?!

BiB winks

JadeRHB: different stages were funny

JadeRHB: army man, pilot etc

HenriettaF: that's probably because that is what they think we expect of them

JadeRHB: it was a portrait of themselves, I think that's what they were interested in at the time

BjB: perhaps this is also a good time to let children know that they can make mistakes...that this is part of the learning process

JadeRHB: yes! I sometimes ask them to choose a piece where they felt they improved or something they found difficult

BjB nods to Jade. Developmental levels in drawing would also be reflected

HenriettaF: yes I tell that to my students

BjB: we may tell that to our students, but do we really communicate that important lesson?

JadeRHB: I will teach the same students in G4, I had them in grade 2 too, I like that they can look back over their work and see their own development

HenriettaF: where I teach the lessons are structured and so there is little time for fun time but I make the best of it.

HenriettaF: that would be a great idea Jade

JadeRHB: I also try and feed forward and feed back on their work

JadeRHB: something they did well, something to improve

HenriettaF: great idea

BjB agrees...goal setting

JadeRHB: mmm, goal setting something I need to take more time with

BjB: that is difficult with kids in elementary especially...

BjB: they each learn at their own pace

HenriettaF: you are so right

JadeRHB: we do a cooperative council every week where they compliment each other, this week we did improvements for next year some of them were quite insightful

BjB: very cool, Jade!

BjB: Kinders might not be quite so advanced

HenriettaF: they do give feedback but I have to make sure that it is controlled.

JadeRHB: it's been great I recommend it we also use it as a time that they can criticize or congratulate, it's when they have difficulty solving their own problems they draw on the class for help

JadeRHB: what do you mean controlled

HenriettaF: well make sure that they stay on the positive side and not negative comments

JadeRHB: feed forward and feed back is positive

BjB: do your students keep journals?

HenriettaF: I know but how do you get them to understand to keep it all positive without it turning it into neg.

JadeRHB: e.g. used punctuation well, next time you might proofread for spelling

JadeRHB: I tried journals with g6, they wrote the same thing after awhile...as little as possible

HenriettaF: you did this with kindergarten Jade?

JadeRHB: the feed forward feed back?

JadeRHB: the e.g. was a g4 example

HenriettaF: what's a G4 e.g.

JadeRHB: grade 4 sorry

HenriettaF: ok

JadeRHB: kindergarten might be I really like the way you shared your pens today, let's try and do it tomorrow too

HenriettaF: sounds good I guess I'll give it a try

JadeRHB: you might find you do it already if you analyse yourself

HenriettaF: you might be right

BjB: let's get back to assessment...would you keep anecdotal records on the children's discussions?

JadeRHB: yes,

HenriettaF: how would you do this Jade

JadeRHB: I can't say I do it often I would like to do it more

HenriettaF: please give an example

JadeRHB: plan cooperative group activities, rotate, listen in a discussion

BjB . o O (social interaction would probably be an important competency)

HenriettaF: how would you assess it?

JadeRHB: and listening to what they actually saying about the topic

JadeRHB: critical thinking, communication

HenriettaF: would you use a rubric

JadeRHB: you could

HenriettaF: sounds interesting.

JadeRHB: I hate to be a party pooper but I think I'll get back to my show, thanks a lot

JadeRHB: see you next time

BjB waves bye to Jade

JadeRHB left the room (signed off).

HenriettaF: Henrietta waves bye

HenriettaF: to Jade this is

BjB: Tell me about the course you're taking, Henrietta

HenriettaF: It's an on line course dealing with Internet.

BjB: is your professor holding any real time discussions in Tapped In?

HenriettaF: yes sometimes

HenriettaF: I'm also taking two other courses on campus dealing with technology

BjB: sounds like you have a boatload of work!

HenriettaF: boy do I ever.

BjB: did you get an explanation of how Tapped In can help you as an educator?

HenriettaF: well I missed the first session on it but I'm learning as I go

BjB nods. I just don't want you to feel like your participation in the community has to end when the courses end...

BjB: one of the most important features of Tapped In is that it's a sustainable community

HenriettaF: it won't I promise I am learning so many new ideas to take back to the classroom

BjB smiles. It's easy to get overwhelmed with all the new ideas...

BjB: and as soon as you learn one thing, a new thing comes out!

HenriettaF: you are so right but it is of great interest to me

BjB chuckles. To me too!

BjB: what are some of the sites you're learning about?

BjB: btw, there is a wonderful K-3+ Resources group that I recommend you join

HenriettaF: right now mostly things that help in my classes such as search engines

HenriettaF: what is it

BjB: how about I show you the K-3 group room? Would you like to do that?

HenriettaF: sure

HenriettaF: what do I do

BjB: when you see me leave this room, Henrietta, click on the online tab to the left of this

chat window

HenriettaF: ok

BjB: then click one time on BJB and the door icon at the bottom

BjB: ready?

HenriettaF: yes

BjB left the room.

BjB joined the room.

HenriettaF joined the room.

HenriettaF: I did it

BjB smiles happily...excellent, Henrietta!

HenriettaF: now what

BjB: if you look at the screen above this chat window you will see many resources here

HenriettaF: how do I get out of detached

BjB: close your chat and it will attach or just overlap your screens

HenriettaF: ok it's done

BjB: I'm going to show you how to join this group, Henrietta

HenriettaF: ok let's do it

BjB: by joining the group you are subscribed to the discussion board

BjB: do you see the welcome note on the web window?

HenriettaF: yes

HenriettaF: what do you mean by subscribed to the discussion board

BjB: scroll down on the welcome note to the last sentence: This is the group room for K

to 3+ Resource Room

BjB: and click on the green i in that sentence

BjB: you should see the group ID page now

BjB: and a sentence Join this group

HenriettaF: I'm still trying to find the K-3 resource room

BjB: did you find the welcome note?

BjB . o O (it's very long)

HenriettaF: found it

HenriettaF: I found the id page and join this group (in green)

BjB: click on join this group

HenriettaF: it says I have successfully joined the group

BjB: when you've successfully joined click on Room View at the top of your screen

HenriettaF: done

BjB: now find the pull down favorite places menu in the top right...

BjB: there is a door icon on the left and a Go! button on the right

HenriettaF: ok found it

BjB: drop the menu down

BjB: you will see that there is a link or passageway to this group room now

HenriettaF: ok done

BjB: you can use that menu to move to any room listed from any location in Tapped In

BjB: I mentioned the discussion board earlier...

BjB: joining a group subscribes you to the discussion board...

HenriettaF: I click on K-3 resource room

BjB: this is how group members can communicate between real time discussions. The discussion board is like an email list

BjB: Susan also sends out reminders of upcoming discussions

HenriettaF: ok

BjB: well, I think we did pretty well even if Maryann didn't join us! Do you feel this was a worthwhile discussion, Henrietta?

HenriettaF: yes and I thank you for all your help!

BjB: my pleasure! Tapped In is a wonderful resource...and the people I've met here are fantastic

HenriettaF: I will be mentioning this to my teacher friends.

BjB: I'm going to go to the WriteTalk discussion which will be starting in about 5 minutes.

HenriettaF: ok bye
