**RyanCL**: Thanks BJ. This is definitely a bit overwhelming but enjoyable.

**BJB2** smiles. Tapped In is a pretty cool place

**RyanCL**: I see we have the two of us and we're waiting on 15!

**BJB2**: well, one more would be nice. If Maryann doesn't log in we'll do some stuff on our own, Ryan

**BJB2**: while we wait....

**BJB2**: take a look at the stuff above this chat window

**RyanCL**: Sounds good. Maybe we can just wait a few minutes to see how it plays out.

**BJB2**: Maryann has some featured files and links

**RyanCL**: How can I get there???

**BJB2**: do you see the screen above this chat?

**RyanCL**: Never mind...I See the screen above. Thanks

**BJB2**: there is a welcome note.

**BJB2**: below the welcome note is featured items

BJB2: those are all live links....when you click on them a new window will open for you

**RyanCL**: So I've tried to open a few and I keep getting a response that they will not open...any suggestions on a program to use for access?

**BJB2**: what won't open? I just clicked on the assessment plan and it opened

**BJB2**: and Test items opened....those are pdf files

**RyanCL**: When I clicked on the plan it asked me to choose a program to open the file with...

**BJB2**: adobe acrobat

RyanCL: K

**BJB2**: Tell me a little about what you teach, Ryan...sounds very challenging

**BJB2**: I recently read where a school in Harrisburg is starting an alternative school for K-2 for acting out kids

**BJB2** . o O ( the plan is that by the time they're in middle school they will no longer be a problem )

**RyanCL**: Well I definitely have a new story for my book every day! I cover 9-12 with another teacher. I started the program. With the amount of kids we have they needed a new teacher. Our rosters are up to about 22 give or take depending on who leaves or not. The best way to describe it is there is a new problem everyday.

**BJB2** nods solemnly. Is your classroom self contained?

**RyanCL**: Well officially we're all inclusion. My kids have a lot of issues. If they're having a good day I may not see them. Some I only touch base with a few times a month. Others are in the room constantly. We have a great support staff and my admin is so supportive. I'm a grad of Norwin and my dad is a retired principal. The guys I work for are great.

**RyanCL**: It's sort of a hit or miss on a daily basis.

**BJB2** nods. How do the kids get referred to your classroom?

**RyanCL**: All the evaluations are done on a school psychologist evaluation as well as doctor evals. We work their primary disability as an emotional problem as opposed to a learning disability.

**BJB2**: I've had a little experience with these kinds of kids, Ryan...

**RyanCL**: I love my job...it's hard for content teachers to realize what we do...I actually don't have any formal classes or even have a gradebook. We monitor and work as the kids need us. It's great to see a profile.

**BJB2**: I'm sure the kids appreciate all you do for them!

**BJB2**: by the time we get our kids, most of them are so institutionalized or have perfected their games

**BJB2**: that it's difficult to get past the emotional and social issues so the students can learn

**RyanCL**: I have to apologize since this is my first time on the sight I can't give you a profile...I graduated in 1998 and graduated from Saint Francis in 2003. Extended plan! Outside of school I just got engaged a few weeks ago to my wonderful better half of over 2 years! It's exciting! It must be tough for you to try and work them in to a normal routine. My kids are bright for the most part but like you said...it's social and emotional

**BJB2**: congratulations on your engagement! How exciting :-)

**BJB2**: I'm going to show you how to edit your profile, Ryan...

**BJB2**: click on the ME tab at the top of your screen

**BJB2**: then click on Settings on the right of the yellow menu bar

**RyanCL**: It's great. We've lived together for a year and have a dog! Sounds great!

**BJB2**: from ME/Settings you can edit your profile, description, change your email and change your password

**BJB2**: make sure your email is correct and up to date...

RyanCL: I'm in...thanks!!!!

**BJB2**: when you log out you will be emailed a transcript of our text chat

RyanCL: Excellent!!!

**RyanCL**: I am really excited about the site and will have to spend some time over break to create a profile.

**RyanCL**: Are you around the capital??

BJB2: about 25 miles nw

**BJB2**: in Perry County

**BJB2**: you know how to view the calendar, Ryan?

**BJB2** . o O (Tapped In tab then Calendar in the blue menu bar)

MaryannDu joined the room.

**BJB2**: all the events on the calendar are real time text chats

MaryannDu: hi

**BJB2** faints

MaryannDu: so sorry

MaryannDu: lol

BJB2: Hi, Maryann!

MaryannDu: Hi

**BJB2**: I was worried

MaryannDu: thanks for the email

**RyanCL**: I viewed the calendar. There's a lot to see! Hi Maryann

MaryannDu: I just got back from Troy NY and totally forgot everything

MaryannDu: lol

**BJB2**: Ryan is a new TI member....

MaryannDu: hi Ryan

MaryannDu: how are you?

**RyanCL**: It's crazy around...Hi...great to be a part of the site

RyanCL: Life's great

**BJB2** . o O (community, Ryan;-))

MaryannDu: lol

**MaryannDu**: so what have you been doing?

**BJB2**. o O (Ryan recently got engaged:) No wonder he thinks life's great!)

MaryannDu: ok

MaryannDu: sounds very nice

**RyanCL**: I was just telling BJ I got engaged...summer of 2009...my fiancé is a teacher in the district...that's how we met

**BJB2**: we've been discussing emotionally challenged students

**RyanCL**: you two are fast

MaryannDu: what do you teach?

RyanCL: High School ES

MaryannDu: ok

**BJB2**: Maryann is much better at assessment lingo than I am, Ryan.

MaryannDu: do you work with teachers or is it self contained

MaryannDu: pull out of self contained

**RyanCL**: Both...mostly I go out and have the other ES teacher work with the kids and we have an instructional aide too.

MaryannDu: ok

**MaryannDu**: what are some of the issues you are coming across?

**RyanCL**: My kids have a tough time getting organized...we work hard and have seen improvement...their emotional concerns with their peers and home lives are a daily battle

MaryannDu: right

**MaryannDu**: do your kids get other kinds of help?

**RyanCL**: I love them and have a great relationship with them...most of them have outside help...I have kids that get in home and some that are on probation which helps

**MaryannDu**: I would imagine that each of them comes with a variety of problems

**RyanCL**: Every kid is so different in their own way...it' funny but after you get to know them you almost know what to expect

**MaryannDu**: right. they have a pattern of behavior and thought processes

**RyanCL**: It's funny because most of the issues they face start at home!

MaryannDu: yes, I agree.

**MaryannDu**: and school has to be the place that they learn that there is something different. I think

MaryannDu: that they can succeed no matter what is on the outside

**RyanCL**: I never know what I'm going to get when I walk through the door...school at times is put on the back burner

MaryannDu: yes. it has to be

**MaryannDu**: but you can also work both in together.

**MaryannDu**: I once worked with a group of 7-8 graders, about 9 of them

**RyanCL**: We always do...I'm in constant contact with parents...it makes it easy...they are very supportive

**MaryannDu**: who all had really serious emotional issues and were not succeeding in school, but had been, or could have been doing much better.

**MaryannDu**: that is great about the parents

**MaryannDu**: we created a reading program that addressed their emotional needs and their need to do much better in reading

**RyanCL**: it's funny how kids with ES issues bring so much to the table

MaryannDu: yes

**MaryannDu**: they see and understand a lot and need to filter it out and figure out they are not alone

**RyanCL**: I have a girl who is literally a genius beyond her age but has such an issue at home we'll never know where she'll end up

**MaryannDu**: yes. but she can take control and learn how to figure that out.

**MaryannDu**: what grade??

MaryannDu: hs

**MaryannDu**: so she has a bit more autonomy and ability to find out how to move forward

**MaryannDu**: do counselors help find colleges, get the kids tested, or do you have mentors who help the kids find out that there is more out there?

**BJB2**: I would think that learning how to take control would be very enabling to that child

MaryannDu: yes.

**RyanCL**: Right...the problem is she's 15 and really acts like she's 25...so mature and yet so young and ignorant...she is so caught up in everything around her

MaryannDu: right

**MaryannDu**: with a mentor she could learn to focus on what she wants and use those skills to create a path

**RyanCL**: We work well with the guidance dept. Most go on to pursue a degree

**BJB2**: do you have medication issues?

**MaryannDu**: find out who to talk to, research areas she might like to study, etc

**RyanCL**: We work with outside Drs but sometimes it's never right

**MaryannDu**: that is good about pursuing a degree

MaryannDu: right

**RyanCL**: she will be amazing in a college setting if she can get away from home

**MaryannDu**: would she be able to if she got a scholarship etc?

**RyanCL**: yes...the family has no money and both parents are in a bad way...a shame

**BJB2**: what about community college courses to help her now?

**MaryannDu**: part of the process is finding out how to make it happen and where it could happen

**MaryannDu**: yes is that possible

**MaryannDu**: would do you feel that you see she needs right now?

**RyanCL**: She would excel at an ivy league school..ATTENDANCE AND THE LACK OF ability to separate from mom is the problem

MaryannDu: does mom hold on or does she?

**MaryannDu**: 15 year olds usually want to be away from mom!!

**RyanCL**: She needs to be with a family that will treat her like a 15 year old...not a friend

MaryannDu: ok

**MaryannDu**: but since that is not going to happen. and she is smart. and won't be getting a new mom, what could she do that would help her see a different future?

**MaryannDu**: does she want to go to college?

**MaryannDu**: is she in groups at school? clubs?

**RyanCL**: we're working with the PO to provide some help. hopefully we can use law enforcement to help

**RyanCL**: she is a different kind of kid

**MaryannDu**: to get the attendance up???

**RyanCL**: she started a gay straight alliance club which is wonderful but the kids around her struggle with her intelligence

**MaryannDu**: many many kids lead lives that we would be shocked by

**RyanCL**: Her attendance was terrible until we put her on probation

RyanCL: true

**MaryannDu**: so she is good at organizing

**RyanCL**: absolutely

**RyanCL**: be right back

**MaryannDu**: she needs a new organizing task. and to identify that she is highly intelligent and that she may not fit in for all the time, but that she has a role to play with her classmates

MaryannDu: ok

**RyanCL**: Ladies...I just got a call from my future wife...my dog is out of control..thank you so much for the insight...I hope to chat soon.

**RyanCL**: Enjoy the holiday

MaryannDu: ok

MaryannDu: enjoy!

**BJB2**: you too, Ryan. Nice meeting you

MaryannDu: see you maybe after the holiday!

**RyanCL**: Very nice meeting both of you!

**RyanCL**: I hope sooner than that

BJB2: Classroom Assessment will meet in January, Ryan

**BJB2** . o O ( second Thursday )

MaryannDu: lol

**BJB2** . o O ( if Maryann remembers ;-) )

RyanCL: Thanks...nite!

MaryannDu: lol

**MaryannDu**: and it is on my calendar

MaryannDu: It is interesting what teachers questions are

**BJB2**: I always learn so much.

**MaryannDu**: and how they think about things

MaryannDu: I do too!

**MaryannDu**: do you get the same kinds of questions?

MaryannDu: sort of core questions

**BJB2**: always...no matter what the topic

MaryannDu: right

MaryannDu: that's what I figured
