MaureenB: love Spell City shared it with my 4th grade team and introduced it to the third grade

SusanR: since literacy is the topic of the day

SusanR: adore spell city

SusanR: Here is the link

MaureenB: Writing in math is so important. They need to be able to show their thinking.

SusanR: It's is a place where your students can practice their spelling words through teaching, games, and practice tests.

SusanR: Can be used for word study or thematic study

SusanR: In the teaching section, students hear the word and a sentence including the word before the word is spelled for them.

SusanR: In the game section, students can choose to play an online word search, hang mouse (like hang man), and word scramble with their spelling words.

SusanR: Teachers can save spelling lists on the site

SusanR: Students login with the class information to access that weeks spelling list.

SusanR: and it's FREE

MaureenB: I have my last 3 spelling units up there

ShayneTr: I wish you could use other languages, too. This is great.

SusanR: It uses a REAL human voice that says both the word and the word in a sentence

SusanR: not as open ended; but useful is Word Builder

SusanR: When you create a list, it does not appear on your homepage or on the Find Your List page. Your list is pending and needs to be approved by a SpellingCity moderator. This usually takes less than a day. After it is approved, it will appear on your homepage and on the search page.

MaureenB: I have the kids do a practice test for homework and play the games

MaureenB: they love it

SusanR: Not as open ended is Word Builder

SusanR: from Houghton Mifflin

SusanR: Students are told a word, in the context of a sentence, and then have to spell it. It is designed as a game, and there are literally hundreds, if not thousands, of opportunities to play.
