LynneW: Welcome all to this month's E-Portfolio Discussion group.

SusanR: I always look for a quick way out...teachers are sooo busy

LynneW: My name is Lynne Wolters and I am your group "mom".

LynneW: Let's do self-introductions. Anyone may begin.

SusanR: I like that "group mom"

LynneW smiles

BJB2: I'm a retired communications and art teacher in Pennsylvania and am on Tapped In helpdesk

LisaBa: I am Lisa. I teach high school and college

LisaBa: I am new to Tapped In

LynneW: Lisa, where are you from?

SusanR: I am a substitute teacher and moderator of the K to 3+ Great Resources sessions here from Ottawa, Ontario

LisaBa: I am from Indiana originally, but I now live in PA

LynneW: Lisa you are warmly welcomed.

LisaBa: I have not used electronic portfolios before, but I am looking into it.

LynneW: Do you know about detaching the chat module and enlarging the text?

LisaBa: Thanks! This is a great tool for teachers.

LisaBa: No, I don't.

LynneW: At the top of this chat module (upper right) is an ACTIONS drop down menu.

LisaBa: Yes.

LynneW: Select DETACH and the chat module will be released and you can enlarge it in size.

LynneW: Keeps the scrolling of text down.

LisaBa: That helps!

LynneW: If you prefer, you may also go back to the ACTIONS menu and choose LARGER TEXT.

LisaBa: Good. Thank you.

LynneW: Sure.

LynneW: Jeff -- are you introducing yourself?

LynneW: Jeff is a help desk volunteer and comes from Forest Grove, OR

LisaBa: Okay. Hi, Jeff.

LynneW: I have some links posted on our group room page to some new to me resources. However,

LynneW: before we take a look at them, are there specific questions anyone would like pose?

LisaBa: I am wondering about the difference between a website and an e-portfolio.

LisaBa: What makes them different?

LynneW: Great question!

LynneW: Anyone want to respond?

BJB2: good question, Lisa...I was wondering if the site Sue shared was actually a collection of websites

LynneW: Electronic portfolios are not necessarily web hosted.

BJB2. o O (rather than an eportfolio)

LisaBa: Okay. So technically I could do e-portfolios with Word, though they wouldn't be very fancy.

LynneW: They could reside on a school server, a hard drive, a jump drive, or a CD.

LynneW: Yes

LynneW: Many portfolios are created in PowerPoint.

LisaBa: But are there programs specifically for portfolios? I can see kids having some trouble getting the idea right away.

LynneW: Your question is excellent because it leads us to my bias about the beginning point.

LisaBa: Good

LynneW: What is the purpose of the portfolio and who is the audience?

LynneW: Who "owns" the portfolio?

LisaBa: Both the student and the teacher.

LynneW: The answers to these questions can be highly variable.

LisaBa: Yes.

LynneW: The district may own them as a way to meet NCLB requirements for data collection.

LynneW: They may be a graduation requirement.

LynneW: Or, they may be an integrated, important tool for learning, teaching, and assessing.

LynneW: Or, anything in between.

LynneW: Lisa, you mentioned you are looking into e-portfolios.

LisaBa: Yes.

LynneW: What would be the purpose for your use of them?

LynneW: What grades are your students -- what content area would these portfolios encompass?

SusanR listens

LisaBa: I am big on reflective writing and having workshops. One plus to the e-portfolio would be that my kids wouldn't have to keep up with very many papers.

LisaBa: I teach 9, 10, and college-level students.

LisaBa: I teach English/Writing.

LynneW: Variable levels of ability?

LisaBa: Yes.

LynneW: The creation of any portfolio begins with deep thinking on the part of the adult facilitator.

LisaBa: The kids love anything online, and this would be a way to motivate them and expose them to computer skills.

LisaBa: Yes.

LisaBa: I have only used paper portfolios before.

LynneW: First, you want to be extremely clear about what a portfolio appropriate artifact looks like.

LisaBa: Or on computers in general.

LynneW: How will students be graded or evaluated?

LynneW: If you were to use 100% as a benchmark of full value --

LisaBa: I let them revise until it is entirely correct. I grade them on completing each step.

LynneW: what would the elements be and what would their weight be as you evaluate the portfolios?

LynneW: If you goal is computer use and familiarization with software, you would probably encourage demonstrations of this proficiency via use of various and/or increasing proficiency within a software.

LynneW: If you place more importance on the quality of research or writing or critical thinking

LisaBa: Yes. But I think portfolios are important not for grading, but just for showing progress over time.

LynneW: Your direction for creation of artifacts must align perfectly.

LynneW: I agree.

LynneW: I believe the most powerful experience is for students to take

LynneW: full ownership over their portfolios as a reflection of themselves as learners.

LynneW: It is an amazing experience to see a poem artfully put to an electronic page with a sound file of the student explaining their thoughts and feelings as they created the poem.

LisaBa: These are the ideas I need to learn.

LisaBa: I would not think to have students incorporate sound.

LynneW: Students now have a forum and the means for going deeper and more meaningfully into the learning process -- with the benefit of an authentic audience.

LisaBa: Yes.

LisaBa: Genuine purpose is very important.

LisaBa: And a real audience...

LynneW: You can have students create an i-movie that is a compilation of their poems to create a video anthology.

LynneW: This would be an artifact as well.

LisaBa: Have them do a reading of their own poem?

LynneW: Digital camera pictures are great artifacts as well.

LisaBa: Yes.

LynneW: Yes.

LynneW: Or, buddy up with a younger class of students.

LisaBa: This is good. I have thought about multi-modal compositions before, but I never got around to using them.

LynneW: The possibilities are endless.

LisaBa: I would like to get time-saving suggestions for e-portfolio assignments.

LynneW: These can be successful but, as you can imagine, pre-planning is very important.

LisaBa: Yes!

LisaBa: The other problem is that my students are not very good with computers.

LisaBa: They have had very little exposure.

LynneW: There are many eportfolio resources in this group room. Additionally, there are many free quality resources online.

LynneW: First, you want to decide if you want to use an online hosting service or if you want to simply burn CD/DVD copies of these portfolios.

LisaBa: These could be saved on GoogleDocs, correct?

LynneW: Dr. Helen Barrett is considered the "mother" of eportfolios. She has an extensive web site with many resources.

LynneW: Yes

LisaBa: Good.

LynneW: Another consideration for students that age...

LynneW: how long will they be available and will they be viewable by others.

LisaBa: I hate to leave so soon, but I was actually on to meet my students at 7:00 ET. I was just browsing and came across this room. Are the resources always available?

LynneW: Parents, prospective employers, scholarship committees, etc.

LisaBa: You have given me good direction to begin!

LynneW: Yes, 24/7. Help yourself. Please think about joining this group.

LynneW: Thanks.

LynneW: Have a good evening.

LisaBa: I didn't know I could join.

LisaBa: I am still learning all of this! :)

LynneW: Sue, I really want to explore the Bamboo Project.

LisaBa: Thanks! Have a good evening.
