**BJB2**: You've participated in the ePortfolios discussions before?

BillBe: nope

**BJB2**: ahhhh....then I suggest you take a look at the stuff on the welcome screen

BillBe: everything on TI is new to me

**BJB2**: how exciting!

**BJB2** . o O ( I still feel that way after almost 11 years )

**BJB2**: do you have an idea of what an eportfolio should be?

**BillBe**: would you please tell me how to get back to 'welcome'?

BillBe: uh, just found it

**BJB2**: do you see Room View at the top of your screen?

**BJB2** . o O ( that happens to me all the time too! Especially in a store when I ask for something I can't find )

**BillBe**: it's the best way of finding something!

**BJB2** smiles and nods

**BJB2**: I would think that an eportfolio for your clients would consist of digital stories, blogs, and positive personal sales pitches

**BillBe**: really difficult to say--even getting them to do an ordinary portfolio is quite difficult

**BJB2**: what would you consider an 'ordinary' portfolio?

**BillBe**: I have worked mainly with 40+ people in the 'lower' socioeconomic ranks

**HeidiMe** joined the room.

**BillBe**: paper in plastic envelopes

BJB2: yay! You made it back, Heidi!

**HeidiMe**: yay! I figured out how to do it

BillBe: hurrah

**HeidiMe**: I'm beginning to believe there's a reason I need to prove I can use technology,

haha

**BJB2**: Heidi, meet Bill. Bill, meet Heidi. How about if you two introduce yourselves?

BillBe: hi, Heidi

**BillBe**: couldn't resist doing that

**BJB2** . o O ( where you are, what you teach/do, and what interest you have in ePortfolios

)

**HeidiMe**: hi! I'm a 22 y.o. grad student doing my MS Ed.

**HeidiMe**: I'm studying Career and Technical Education, specifically Agricultural

Ed. and I'm working on my ePortfolio

**BillBe**: I'm a 61-year-old career developer

**HeidiMe**: it's due tomorrow at 9, in fact

BillBe: oh dear

BillBe: I hope it's almost finished

**HeidiMe**: yeah, but this is part of the requirement for me to complete it

**BJB2** chuckles. Good thing you get a transcript of this chat, Heidi!

**HeidiMe**: yeah, I just have to do a few more artifacts

**BillBe**: so BJ and I are artifacts

**HeidiMe**: haha, indeed

**BJB2**: so the thing you two have in common is careers

BillBe: I've always thought so

BJB2 winks at Bill. We're a lot older than Heidi, too.

HeidiMe: haha

**BillBe**: a yawning gulf

BillBe: I have a long background in IT

**BJB2**: here's the perfect opportunity for your discussion, Heidi

**BillBe**: I would like to see if i can support people with no real it skills to build ePortfolios

**HeidiMe**: I'm sure you can

**BJB2** . o O (Lynne Wolters is not able to join us tonight because of the weather )

**HeidiMe**: we've been using Nvu/Kompozer

**BillBe**: has it cut power to her office?

**HeidiMe**: because of the cost (free)

**BillBe**: I know that program

**BJB2**: no, but she has to travel to a computer

**HeidiMe**: although I've been told in the past they used Dreamweaver with more success

**BJB2**: can you tell me more about the program, Heidi. I'm not familiar with it

**HeidiMe**: Nvu is very buggy, kompozer is somewhat better

**BillBe**: a lot more complicated, bigger learning curve

**HeidiMe**: yeah that's what I hear

**HeidiMe**: Nvu is basically WYSIWYG (I think that's right!)

BillBe: that's right

**HeidiMe**: it's a lot like formatting on Word

BillBe: yup

**HeidiMe**: so it's easier for people to pick up because it's familiar

**HeidiMe**: most of the web design has been tables

**BillBe**: it seems more difficult to make programs like Kompozer that do the HTML the

modern way

HeidiMe: I've just decided to keep mine as simple as possible in order to have the

smallest opening for disaster/confusion on my part

**HeidiMe**: is that why they haven't come out with new editions?

BillBe: dunno

**BJB2**: <a href="http://kompozer.net/">http://kompozer.net/</a>

**BJB2** . o O ( for the transcript )

BillBe: sometimes developers simply become bored

**BJB2**: or underfunded

HeidiMe: yeah I'll bet

**HeidiMe**: so, I have a question, are electronic portfolios very common in education

programs? Since I have limited experience with other programs I'm not sure

**BJB2**: who is paying for the development?

**BillBe**: of kompozer?

**HeidiMe**: I guess no one if it's a free program

**BJB2**: Heidi, ePortfolios are becoming more popular....

**BJB2**: and many make use of web 2.0 tools and multimedia

BJB2 . o O ( lots of artifacts ;-))

**HeidiMe** ) haha, thank you very much

**BJB2**: they also provide opportunities for reflective writing to demonstrate learning...like

blogs

HeidiMe: oh wow

**BJB2**: Tapped In is free and it costs a bundle! It was originally funded by the National Science Foundation

**HeidiMe**: ours are static, but it would be really cool to have a dynamic component like a blog during student teaching

**BJB2** nods to Heidi.

**BJB2**: the main issue as I understand it is who 'owns' the portfolio

**HeidiMe**: good point, I guess I forgot that nothing's really "free"

**BillBe**: there are some learning managements systems that include blogging facilities

**BJB2**: and how is the portfolio accessed once the person leaves the institution

**BJB2** nods to Bill

**HeidiMe**: well, I know mine is hosted by my school, but I'd like to think it's my intellectual property!

**BillBe**: I've been assuming that people build eportfolios on neutral territory

**BJB2**: how will you access your portfolio when you graduate, Heidi?

**HeidiMe**: they haven't told us how long they will host it for

**BJB2** nods solemnly...something to consider.

**BJB2**: and...

**HeidiMe**: it's going to stay hosted and available

**BillBe**: even faculty members do not necessarily own the products of their researches

**BJB2**: when you have completed your formal education, does that mean you stop learning and growing?

**HeidiMe**: but I don't know after that date what happens

**HeidiMe**: certainly not

**BJB2** . o O ( shouldn't your portfolio reflect this growth and learning? )

**HeidiMe**: yeah, it should, definitely

**BJB2**: I would hope that a portfolio would be a living document that follows you throughout your career

**BJB2**: Bill, if your clients have computer access, you might want to set up a group for them in Tapped In...

**HeidiMe**: yeah, I hope to make it that way

**BJB2**: it's a great way to start them on the journey of communication.

**BillBe**: thank you, will discuss with the powers that be

**BJB2**: and it would be a safe and structured environment

BillBe: I have many masters

**BJB2** nods to Bill....as do all educators

**BJB2**: Heidi, any comments, questions?

**HeidiMe**: don't you think that the depth and breadth of things you learn is too big to have a portfolio?

**BJB2** waits to be dazzled by Heidi's tech expertise;-)

**BillBe**: it hasn't been for some of us

**BJB2**: ahhhh....good one, Heidi. What do you think, Bill?

**HeidiMe**: sometimes I feel like the things on mine don't communicate nearly enough of what I've learned

BJB2: you also have to consider your audience, Heidi.

**BillBe**: all fooling aside, that's true. There's the problem of somehow projecting oneself

**HeidiMe**: yeah I guess the point is to concentrate on what's most important for my objective

**BillBe**: I have had huge problems with that coming from IT

**BJB2**: your portfolio is being prepared for an authentic audience

**BJB2** . o O ( who have the attention spans of gnats )

HeidiMe: haha

BJB2: so what do you think is the most important feature that a portfolio needs to

illustrate?

**BillBe**: do you have the concept of stories in eportfolios somewhere?

**BJB2**. o O ( and is this for a teacher, an admin, a student, etc? )

**HeidiMe**: there's a part for my reflections on my experience in the journey to become an

educator

**BJB2**: Bill, look at the links that Lynne has under Featured Items on the welcome screen

above this chat

**HeidiMe**: my portfolio's main objective is to market me for jobs

**BJB2** nods to Heidi. That's probably what Bill is seeking for his clients as well.

**BillBe**: although it could be a nightmare to build an ePortfolio might have several paths

through it

**BJB2**: take a look at the whiteboard on the welcome screen too: A symphonic eportfolio

is a whole of life online reflection process that enables the young and not so young to

create their own digital footprint. -CaroleMc

**HeidiMe**: yeah I would think so

**BillBe**: any examples of symphonic eportfolios?

**HeidiMe**: yeah, I'm not quite sure what that means

**BJB2**: I am assuming that would be multimedia

HeidiMe: I see

**HeidiMe**: thanks

**BJB2**. o O ( as in a symphony is composed of many elements, sounds, emotions )

**BillBe**: it also sounds a good way of exploring themes, and so on, in one's life

**BJB2** smiles...cool, Bill

**BillBe**: that could be really, really useful in a careers setting

**HeidiMe**: I like it

**BillBe**: who is Carole Mc?

**BJB2**: sometimes the electronic part of the portfolio is intimidating....

**BJB2**: Carole is a TI member

**HeidiMe**: yes it is

BillBe: thanks

**BJB2** . o O ( lives in Australia, I think )

**BillBe**: we need some software tools specially built for the job--open source would be best

**BJB2**: but you can gather artifacts that are not electronic and compile them....and perhaps scan them into a slide show or ppt

**HeidiMe**: what does open source mean?

**BJB2**: Anyone can use/recreate the technology

**BillBe**: open source means that programmers can see and change the computer code in the program to advance it

**BJB2**: Tapped In is open source, actually. If you wanted to create your own version of Tapped In you could get the codes

**HeidiMe**: oh, okay! thanks, I've always wondered that

**BJB2**: http://tappedin.sourceforge.net/

**BJB2**: the main obstacle is that you need to be pretty comfortable with code

**BillBe**: it should be possible for somebody to copy an image and then just paste it into his ePortfolio without knowing anything about why that should work

**BJB2** . o O ( personally, I think it's smarter to use Tapped In and let them do the maintenance and updates! )

**BillBe**: what's it written in?

**BJB2**: dunno....it's at <a href="http://tappedin.sourceforge.net/">http://tappedin.sourceforge.net/</a>

**BillBe**: an idle question!

**BJB2**: web 2.0 allows a lot of that wysiwyg cut and paste stuff, Bill

**BillBe**: just what I was thinking

**BJB2**: flicker

**BJB2**: most blogs let you add photos and sound files...as do wikis

**BillBe**: need something like iGoogle or Netvibes and some additional widgets for things that people would want to add to an ePortfolio

**HeidiMe**: I'm going to admit this Tapped In site is pretty cool, although at first I found it super confusing

**BJB2** nods to Heidi

**HeidiMe**: I wish there were more people on here

**BillBe**: I think it's the first intros that put a lot of people off things

**BJB2** . o O ( one of the reasons we do regularly scheduled tours )

**HeidiMe**: currently!

**HeidiMe**: oh. that's cool

**HeidiMe**: yeah the front desk part was very helpful!!!

**BillBe**: this is a friendly site, that's for sure

**BJB2**: Heidi, take a look at the internal calendar....click on the Tapped In tab at the top of your screen and then click on calendar in the blue menu bar

**BJB2**: you'll see that the internal calendar is set to your time zone

**BJB2**: Tips and Tricks are the tours

**BJB2**: Tapped In is a community, and as a community we all work together and collaborate

**BillBe**: Heidi, are there any items you've wanted to add to your eportfolio and couldn't?

**HeidiMe**: no, most of it is documents

**HeidiMe**: it's a very simple site

**HeidiMe**: probably not very exciting

**HeidiMe**: I'm not a technological genius, unfortunately

**HeidiMe**: pictures, powerpoints, word docs

**HeidiMe**: everything I use in teaching

**BillBe**: maybe it doesn't seem exciting because it's your life

**BJB2** smiles

HeidiMe: haha, very true

**HeidiMe**: I'm desensitized I reckon

**BillBe**: what do the things you use tend to be like?

**BJB2** . o O ( tend to use in the classroom? )

**BillBe**: wish I'd said that

**BJB2**: just trying to clarify the question, Bill

BillBe: I know and I'm glad you did

**HeidiMe**: well, to be honest with you I try to not use PowerPoints in the class because I

think I use it as a crutch and it keeps me from moving around the classroom

**HeidiMe**: and at my student teaching site we don't have a projector set up

**HeidiMe**: but that may change when I get my own classroom

**BillBe**: if you need some free time you can use it to put your class to sleep

**HeidiMe**: I do a lot of hands-on stuff

**HeidiMe**: yeah exactly

HeidiMe: so I'm going to try to get as many pictures as possible of my activities to use in

the student teaching part of the portfolio

**BJB2**: do you have the students work in small groups? in large groups?

**HeidiMe**: both, really

**BillBe**: pictures could reinforce the way you're seen

**BJB2**: what are employers looking for in high school graduates? Do they need to know all the details of a job?

**BJB2** . o O ( or do they need to know how to learn new ways to do things )

**BJB2**: can your students problem solve?

**HeidiMe**: I think they look for people who are willing to learn

**HeidiMe**: good point, I see what you're saying

**BJB2**: what about project based learning?

**BJB2** . o O ( there is a PBL discussion in January in Tapped In )

**HeidiMe**: I'm v. interested in implementing it

**BJB2**: and there is a Global PBL group you can join and look at the resources they already have

**HeidiMe**: in January I'm going to start taking over more of my cooperating teacher's classes

**HeidiMe**: so that's good timing

**HeidiMe**: I'll have to join it

**BJB2**: you have your hands full, I'm sure, Heidi.

**BJB2**: the first couple of years of teaching are the hardest...

**HeidiMe**: I do, but unfortunately I'm going to have to go and try and empty them a little bit by putting the finishing touches on this portfolio!

**HeidiMe**: yeah, my friend is doing NYC teacher's fellowship

**HeidiMe**: and she is super stressed

**BJB2**: just learning basic classroom management, meeting administrative requirements, planning lessons

**HeidiMe**: hopefully my kids are going to be a little easier than hers

HeidiMe: yeah

**HeidiMe**: quite the learning curve, right?

**BJB2**: just remember that Tapped In is here to offer support...

**BJB2**: and a shoulder to cry on if you need it ;-)

**HeidiMe**: haha! thanks, I will remember that

**HeidiMe**: thank you both for your time, my portfolio and I thank you!!!

**BJB2**: I taught for 24 years and each year was a new adventure

HeidiMe: oh dear, I'm sure

**BJB2**: that's what keeps your teaching fresh and your students engaged

**HeidiMe**: hopefully I'll talk to you again soon. :)

**HeidiMe**: oh engagement

**HeidiMe**: the e word!!!

HeidiMe: haha

**BJB2**: thanks for joining the discussion, Heidi and for joining Tapped In

**HeidiMe**: no problem!

**HeidiMe**: goodnight!!!

BJB2 . o O ( you were engaged in the discussion )

**BJB2** waves goodnight

HeidiMe: HAHA

HeidiMe: nice

BillBe: take care, guys
