MichaelHo: Nice to have you here Jackie.

**SonyaF**: This would be good for students who want to interact in tutorials over the summer or maybe a Prep Class for SAT.

MichaelHo: Absolutely Sonya.

**SonyaF**: Even a way to have summer school class

MichaelHo: In fact, I was thinking I would offer summer courses this year in

science...SAT prep or

**MichaelHo**: AP biology lectures.

JackieAM: I really enjoyed it. Talk to you later.

MichaelHo: By Jackie...keep in touch!

MichaelHo: Bye.

MichaelHo: (bad typing today for me!)

MichaelHo: Sonya...

**BJ:** Correctional facilities might be interested in your program, Michael

**JackieAM** left the room.

MichaelHo: Good thought BJ!

JeffC: back

MichaelHo: Indeed, my wonderful friend Beth works with kids who are in detention or

just getting out....

**SonyaF**: Would the lectures just be for students, I would love to interact in a Prep lecture for my certification

MichaelHo: Sonya...

**JeffC**: I have an interview with a correctional facility on Thursday... running a computer lab for the students there.

**MichaelHo**: I'm now starting to work on talking to folks who might want prof. dev.

MichaelHo: Like you!

**MichaelHo**: I could give university quality lectures in biology.

MichaelHo: Cool Jeff....I'll be interested in what they have.

MichaelHo: Real need for out of area teachers to get some certification, right Sonya?

MichaelHo: Especially with NCLB.

SonyaF: Right

**MichaelHo**: You are in CA Sonya? Is that right?

MichaelHo: I forget.

SonyaF: Nope Houston, Texas yee haw

MichaelHo: Ooops....sorry.

**MichaelHo**: I'll be down in Tejas this May for the Rethinking Education Conference, just a by the way.

**MichaelHo**: But, anyway, yes...this could be great for teachers wanting professional development and certification.

**MichaelHo**: I can connect to them directly and give them the high quality instruction they need. Easy!

**SonyaF**: Distance Education too

**MichaelHo**: Yes...schools can use this system for delivering distance ed...is that what you mean?

SonyaF: Yes, this would be a good way to do online classes

**MichaelHo**: Right. That is indeed the point. To do online learning in a way that respects the role of the teacher/knowledge expert.

**MichaelHo**: And the needs of the learner!

**MichaelHo**: And you should see it at work when I hold live office hours online on PersonalProfessors.com

**SonyaF**: I am in an online course this semester where we link assignments to our website for posting. They call it Online discussions but not quite like this

**MichaelHo**: Jeff told me about a new conferencing type product that just came out, and last week I had live office hours for the first time with it with students in NY and Oregon.

**MichaelHo**: I was talking live with them and doing genetics problems, they were helping each other out...it was great.

**MichaelHo**: Yeah Sonya....that's using the Web as fancy mail....not revolutionary in my opinion.

**MichaelHo**: But, that is the direction most online learning systems seem to have gone...don't ask me why.....I'll go off on a long polysyllabic diatribe!

**SonyaF**: I agree but convenient with a three year old

**JeffC**: The software is called ASAP... you can download a free 15 day trial from <a href="http://asap.convoq.com/Help/Viewlets/getstart/getstart.swf">http://asap.convoq.com/Help/Viewlets/getstart/getstart.swf</a>

**MichaelHo**: Yes...posting assignments that way is convenient, no doubt. But it is essentially the century old correspondence school model.

**MichaelHo**: I think the Web has much more to offer than that.

**MichaelHo**: Like what I showed you today, and what we are doing now, and what my conferencing system allows.

**MichaelHo**: In fact, I make a point to tell people we have no text content....just context.

MichaelHo: I think that captures our values succinctly.

**MichaelHo**: Thanks for posting the link Jeff.

BJ: Michael, did you mention anything about bandwidth and highspeed connections?

BJ: I'm on dialup and heard you clearly...

BJ: but you did drop out once and the buffer had to reload

MichaelHo: Yes, BJ....I should have said something about that....

**SonyaF**: I experienced the same

**MichaelHo**: I intentionally found a tool that can be used with low-bandwidth, precisely because most people can not receive high-bandwidth stuff...

MichaelHo: and I encode at 56k.....your modem speed.

**BJ** nods. Thanks.

MichaelHo: So a little buffering at 5:00 on the West coast is not bad at all...there is a

huge surge in Internet usage at that time...and the Internet as whole gets a bit

MichaelHo: bogged down

MichaelHo: But...the voice quality is surprisingly good, isn't it?

SonyaF: Yes

MichaelHo: And the writing comes across nicely too, eh?

SonyaF: Yes

**MichaelHo**: Pretty powerful tool, I think. Most people's jaws drop when they first see it!:)

**BJ:** yes, the sound quality and the whiteboard feature were very good

**SonyaF**: Mine did, I was telling everyone here in the lab to come and see as you demonstrated

**MichaelHo**: That's funny!

**MichaelHo**: Yeah..my brother even once attended a lecture in a car on I-80 traveling across Iowa!

MichaelHo: He had a wireless connection.

MichaelHo: And wasn't driving!!

**MichaelHo**: Thankfully.

SonyaF: Everyone was impressed

**SusanR** joined the room.

MichaelHo: That's nice. It really works well.

SonyaF: Hi Susan MichaelHo: Hi Susan. SusanR enters quietly

SusanR: Hi

MichaelHo waves

**SonyaF**: Can you show Susan what we are talking about real quick?

**MichaelHo**: Susan..we did a demonstration of my online instructional system.

SusanR: Greetings SusanR: Thanks

MichaelHo: Sure...do you have a minute?

**SusanR**: Can I explore on my own after the session?
