BjB: wiki's are all pretty much the same. Wikipedia allows anyone to edit and/or submit to the wiki

FredK: Anybody can edit it?

BjB nods

FredK: Where do you set up wikis

BjB: although they've tightened up some of the parameters about editing and do check for malicious editing

BjB: there are several free ones...let me see if I can find one for you

BjB: pbwiki.com

BjB. oO(free)

FredK: I shall explore later like I did with del.icio.us yesterday

BjB: http://freemind.sourceforge.net/wiki/index.php/Main Page

FredK: Thanks Bj

BjB: http://snipsnap.org/space/start

BjB: I know the webheads use a wiki, but I haven't come across it yet

FredK: I think I have seen that before (snipsnap). have you been using it ?

BjB: <u>http://www.wetpaint.com/</u>

FredK . o O (sounds like our house)

BjB: I've not used any wiki except the one that Heather used for the festival

BjB. o O (that's the one I'm trying to find)

FredK: Sorry I missed the festival, but my honey-do-s got ahead of me

BjB: Heather had all the announcements on the wiki...and we could all go in and edit if necessary

BjB: If you see Heather, ask her [Ed. Note: http://educationalwikis.wikispaces.com/]

FredK: Copy and paste from there?

BjB: yes

KarenL joined the room.

BjB hugs Karen. Welcome back!

FredK: Welcome Back

KarenL: Yes, I traveled to the computer crash site. Not a good landing. . .

KarenL: Thanks, glad to be back!

HollyAt joined the room.

BjB: hi, Holly. Welcome

HollyAt: Hi

FredK: We have been discussing wikis

FredK: hi Holly

HollyAt: Great.

HollyAt: Hi

KarenL: What did I miss?

BjB: I was showing some urls for free wiki's to Fred, Karen

FredK: Bj had some sites to share

KarenL: Okay, I'll get the transcript with the urls, I hope?

BjB: do you recommend any particular wiki?

BjB: let me paste them again for you, Karen

BjB: pbwiki.com

BjB: <u>http://freemind.sourceforge.net/wiki/index.php/Main_Page</u>

BjB: <u>http://www.wetpaint.com/</u>

KarenL: Well, I haven't quite explored the wikis yet, but someone recommended pbwiki and seedwiki.

KarenL: or seed something.

KarenL: Never heard of wetpaint, but that would be appropriate for an artist!:)

HollyAt: I used pbwiki in an online literacy course I took this summer. I found it very easy to use.

BjB: Heather used a wiki during the festival, but can't remember which one

BjB: thanks, Holly

KarenL: Is this the one where you have to set up an account?

BjB. o O (we're learning from each other on this one)

KarenL: And can you create more than one wiki on that account?

BjB: I think they all may have that, Karen

KarenL: Okay. . .I got some work to do before next Thursday.

BjB: Holly, are you here for WriteTalk?

HollyAt: Yep.

FredK: What is your group again, Karen?

BjB: Sandra hasn't logged in. that usually means she's having connection problems or her back is bad again

KarenL: k-12 language arts. We're going to be talking about blogs, wikis and writing.

KarenL: I hope it is a bad connection. A bad back is very painful. . .

FredK: Sounds very interesting

KarenL: Fred, are you a k-12 teacher?

HollyAt: I teach middle school as well as college students and would like to use wikis with both.

FredK: We didn't do introductions did we

KarenL: You are welcome to join us, whether or not you're a teacher.

KarenL: Oh, I could use some expertise in the middle school. I am so elementary!

FredK: I am a tutor for literacy in SE Oklahoma

KarenL: Cool! You should join us and perhaps even think about being a "guest" moderator.

KarenL: I wouldn't mind one bit. . .

FredK: We focus on adults but sometimes get youth

BjB: I like the name of this wiki, but not sure if it's any good or not: http://wiki.inkscape.org/wiki/index.php/Main Page

KarenL: Perhaps you could do something about literacy and the young adult. . .

KarenL: I mean on. . .

HollyAt: When does your group meet, Karen?

KarenL: The third Thursday of each month. . .right BJ?

BjB: do you know how to read the calendar, Holly?

BjB nods to Karen

KarenL: Holly, I'm sorry. Are you a teacher as well?

FredK: I cheat. I click on the little green "i"

HollyAt: Yes. I teach 7th grade language arts and adolescent literature at the college level. I also teach a 7th/8th grade playwriting class that uses Tapped In to extend their inclass collaborative writing projects.

KarenL: Yes, and you could be a guest moderator, too. We need to sign up both of you before you say no!

FredK . o O (wow)

KarenL: Wikis would be excellent for collaborative writing projects.

KarenL: That's my humble opinion.

FredK: Take a look at the Pushmataha County Literacy Council group room

HollyAt: I'm available unless I end up teaching a class Thursday nights. That's what's kept me from joining this group in the past.

HollyAt: I absolutely agree about using wikis for collaborative projects. Any ideas about doing this?

KarenL: Well, how do you get the students to start writing? Do you have them come up with a topic?

KarenL: Do you have them use any graphic organizers or use any other prewriting strategies?

HollyAt: Yes, sometimes.

KarenL: I wonder if there are any wikis about writing plays...

BjB: what about script writing for your theater group, Holly?

HollyAt: Oh, now that's interesting.

BjB smiles...great minds, Karen

KarenL: BJ, is there a way search wikis for writing plays,

KarenL: I tell ya, nothing like it!

BjB: I know there is reader's theater...that's a good start

HollyAt: I think you're on to something, ladies.

HollyAt: I'm also confident that if I set up the wiki my students could run with the idea of how to use it to write their plays.

KarenL: Oh I love reader's theater. It is great with elementary students, and those who are "beginner" readers. Talk about engaging. . .

BjB: this would go with poetry <u>http://en.wikibooks.org/wiki/Writing Effective Songs</u>

KarenL: you could have your students read a story and have them develop a script based on the story. If it is a chapter book, maybe they could write a scene for that chapter. Then they could act it out.

FredK: This doesn't fit with wikis, but I can share the Literacy Access Online where you have stories and story writing and even a Brouse Aloud http://www.literacyaccessonline.com/index.asp

KarenL: Oooh, and then they could use the wiki for how they would write the scene, create the stage, . . .I'm going to steal this idea myself!!!

KarenL: I'm getting too excited about this!!!

KarenL: Thanks, Fred for this resource. I could use this as well. I do know some students who love to write stories. This would be an excellent source.

FredK: Glad you can use it

HollyAt: Yes, thanks for the resource Fred. I'm going to steal this one too.

KarenL: Yes, Fred, I can see you as a guest moderator. Now, which month would you like to moderate?

BjB grins at Fred

KarenL: Glad you're back Holly!

HollyAt: Thanks. Not sure what happened.

BjB listens to Fred's response

FredK: Lets let me get something together

KarenL: Okay, that sounds like a plan to me!!! Let me know which month is convenient for you. I am very flexible!!!
